Having said that, if the CEC decide to approve this project in spite of the danger to the community, will they be providing insurance or posting bond to cover any and all damages that arise from the project? If not, the CEC should not be permitted to approve the project over the objections of the local community unless they are willing to insure the project.

Since the proposed Compass Energy Storage Project would be located close to areas rated Very High, High and Moderate based on the recently published Fire Hazard Severity Zone ratings, how will Compass provide insurance to cover any damage to the surrounding communities in the event that there is a fire or other disruption?
