Dear Dr. Scott M. Lesch:

Thank you for submitting the Riverside Public Utilities (RPU) 2023 Integrated Resource Plan (IRP). The California Energy Commission (CEC) received the IRP on June 12, 2024, including the four standardized reporting tables.

CEC staff has performed the check for completeness, as described in Chapter 3, Section B.1 of the IRP Guidelines,¹ and has determined that the RPU 2023 IRP is complete.

The IRP Guidelines provide a framework to evaluate the consistency of RPU's IRP with California's energy and other policy goals outlined in Senate Bill 350 (de León, Chapter 547, Statutes of 2015).

Consistent with Senate Bill 350 and the IRP Guidelines, the CEC is reviewing RPU's IRP for consistency with the requirements spelled out in Senate Bill 350 and subsequent legislation. If staff determines there is a need for additional information to facilitate the CEC's review of the IRP, RPU will receive a request for supporting information. The determination finding the IRP consistent or inconsistent with the requirements of the Public Utilities Code Section 9621 will be available once staff completes the analysis.

The CEC anticipates considering adoption of the Executive Director's determination at a CEC business meeting within two months of the determination.
