Dear Ileana Cardenas:

As required by Senate Bill 350 (De León, Chapter 547, Statutes of 2015) (SB 350) (in Public Utilities Code (PUC) Section 9622) the California Energy Commission (CEC) has reviewed the City of Glendale Water and Power's (GWP) Integrated Resource Plan (IRP) filing, which the CEC received on April 29, 2024. CEC staff informed GWP on May 14, 2025 that the IRP filing was complete, as required by Chapter 3, Section B.1 of the *Publicly Owned Utilities' Integrated Resource Plan Guidelines (POU IRP Guidelines)*.<sup>1</sup>

Based on a detailed review and analysis of the IRP, standardized tables, and other supporting information, I determined, as documented in the *Review of City of Glendale Water and Power 2024 Integrated Resource Plan* (September 2025), that GWP's 2024 IRP is consistent with the requirements of PUC Section 9621, and meets California's energy and other policy goals, including:

- Achieving greenhouse gas emission reduction targets commensurate with the electricity sector's percentage of economy wide reductions of 40 percent from 1990 levels by 2030.
- Meeting the Renewables Portfolio Standard of 60 percent by 2030.
- Ensuring planning goals related to retail rates, reliability, transmission and distribution systems.
- Considering the role of renewable resources, grid efficiencies, energy storage, and distributed resources in meeting peak demand.
- Addressing procurement of energy efficiency and demand response, energy storage, transportation electrification, and portfolio diversification.

The *Review of City of Glendale Water and Power 2024 Integrated Resource Plan*, available in Docket No 18-IRP-01, provides the details of CEC staff's review and findings regarding the consistency of GWP's IRP with PUC Section 9621. The CEC anticipates considering adoption of this staff determination at the CEC business meeting on November 12, 2025.
