We have some very good news to share. We have been meeting with ENGIE North America Renewable & Flexible Generation about their plans to develop a Grid-Scale Battery facility in San Juan Capistrano. They are moving forward with State approval and believe they will begin building in the coming year. The facility is less than three miles from campus. They want to ensure there are future workers so they are offering a 5-year commitment to help funds apprenticeships in EWD/CTE programs related to the battery system. They are offering \$150,000 each year for the next 5-years. I am attaching their contract, which is fairly straight forward. This will involve the Foundation as they made it clear that is their intent. Our goal would be to get students into our related programs, and be able to offer incentives to employers in the form of salary match, much like the Samueli grant, for developing approved apprenticeships in the areas identified by the donor.

Next steps will be organizational level meeting with the Foundation team and our EWD team, followed by a meeting with yourselves, the other Exec Team members you want present, the Foundation's Reps, EWD team, and ENGiE's team. I have also attached an FAQ which is very informative about the facility ENGIE is developing.

As background, ENGIE, like other companies we meet with, were impressed by our team's responsiveness, organizational structure, past workforce development success, and our entrepreneurial approach to training and development. This will have tie-ins to our Automotive EV Tech and Autonomous and Advanced Vehicle Systems programs as well as Electronic Technology and Automation Systems programs.

Jessie will reach out to help schedule the meetings in the next few days/weeks.


