

RIGHT HERE IN OUR BACKYARD WHAT IS THE THREAT?

Compass Energy Storage LLC proposes constructing, owning, and operating a 250-megawatt (MW) Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) in the northern portion of San Juan Capistrano, bordering Laguna Niguel.

The project would span approximately 13 acres near Camino Capistrano and Interstate-5, involving:

- Lithium-iron phosphate batteries or similar technologies
- Inverters
- Medium-voltage transformers
- · A switchyard
- A collector substation and other associated equipment

The system could store up to 1,000 megawatt hours of electricity to supply 250 MW of power over four hours.

The Compass Energy Storage Project is planned for a 13-acre site in northern San Juan Capistrano, near Camino Capistrano, Interstate-5, and active railroad tracks. Amtrak strongly opposes the project because of its proximity to the rail line, citing safety hazards such as fire risks and potential operational disruptions.



Key Concerns:

- 1. Fire Hazards: BESS systems have a history of high-temperature fires that can spread rapidly and are difficult to extinguish.
- Toxic Fumes: Battery fires release harmful chemicals, potentially jeopardizing air quality and public health.
- 3. Environmental Risks: Potential groundwater contamination from battery waste.
- 4. Dangerously Near Residents: The proximity to schools, neighborhoods, and wildlife habitats potentially endangers families and ecosystems.
- 5. Noise Pollution: Lengthy construction and ongoing/constant equipment operation.




