# **California Schools Healthy Air, Plumbing, and Efficiency Program Activities and Expenditures**

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## ABSTRACT

The School Energy Efficiency Stimulus Program was established by Assembly Bill 841 (Ting, Chapter 372, Statutes of 2020) and is referred to as the California Schools Healthy Air, Plumbing, and Efficiency Program for program administration. The California Schools Healthy Air, Plumbing, and Efficiency Program consists of two grant programs, the Ventilation Program and Plumbing Program. The programs provide funding to local educational agencies for assessing, maintaining, repairing, and replacing ventilation systems in California schools and funding to local educational agencies and state agencies for replacing aging and water inefficient plumbing fixtures and appliances with water-conserving plumbing fixtures and appliances.

This report is prepared as directed and in compliance with Section 25208 of the Public Resources Code, which says “*The commission shall submit a report to the relevant policy committees of the Legislature and the Joint Legislative Budget Committee describing programmatic activities and spending pursuant to the School Energy Efficiency Stimulus Program.*”

*(b) The report shall include both of the following:*

*(1) A description of any changes to guidelines and budget.*

*(2) A summary of past spending, activities funded, and expected changes in funding and activities for the next year.*

*(c) As part of the report, the commission may include information that is already provided in reports submitted to and approved by the Public Utilities Commission, as applicable.”*

This report describes program activities in Calendar Year 2024, including the budget, grants awarded for HVAC replacement projects, and submitted reports.

## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The School Energy Efficiency Stimulus (SEES) Program was established by Assembly Bill (AB) 841 (Ting, Chapter 372, Statutes of 2020) as an energy efficiency measure during the COVID-19 pandemic to help schools improve air quality and reduce energy use while meeting current classroom ventilation requirements, and to assist local educational agencies (LEA) in making much needed upgrades to school infrastructure. AB 841 directed the California Energy Commission (CEC), as program administrator, to design, administer, and implement the program. Pursuant to Public Utilities Code (PUC) Section 1615(e)(1), the CEC must return all unspent CalSHAPE Program funds to the electric and gas investor-owned utility ratepayers by December 1, 2026. The CEC set an encumbrance deadline of October 31, 2024, for new grant agreements to ensure funds are reverted by this date. The School Energy Efficiency Stimulus Program is referred to as the California Schools Healthy Air, Plumbing, and Efficiency Program.

The California Schools Healthy Air, Plumbing, and Efficiency Program includes two grant programs, the Plumbing Program and Ventilation Program. The Plumbing Program provides funding for local educational agencies and state agencies to replace aging and water inefficient plumbing fixtures and appliances with water-conserving plumbing fixtures and appliances. The Ventilation Program provides funding for local educational agencies to assess, maintain, repair, and replace ventilation systems in schools. The California Schools Healthy Air, Plumbing, and Efficiency Program also creates work opportunities for a skilled and trained workforce and prioritized awards to schools in underserved communities, consistent with the goals of the program.

The CEC adopted program guidelines and began accepting applications in the Fall of 2021. As of the end of 2024, the CEC had awarded more than \$789 million, or 89 percent of the total program budget, in grants to 647 local educational agencies, two California State University campuses, and one community college. This will support 1,114 projects at 4,917 sites -- 49 percent of all school sites in the state. These projects will lead to an estimated 3,303 MTCO<sub>2</sub>e in greenhouse gas emissions reductions and an estimated 65 percent reduction in water usage.

LEAs and state agencies have two years to complete the grant-funded work and submit final documents. For 2025 and 2026, the CEC plans to continue to provide oversight and implement program improvements as we approach the funding balance return date of December 1, 2026, and program sunset date of January 1, 2027. CEC expects to return approximately \$194 million in unused ratepayer funds to the IOUs by December 2026.

This report describes program activities in calendar year 2024, including the budget, oversight activities, final report submittals, and grants awarded.



# CHAPTER 1:

## Introduction

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The School Energy Efficiency Stimulus (SEES) Program was established by Assembly Bill (AB) 841 (Ting, Chapter 372, Statutes of 2020) as an energy efficiency measure during the COVID-19 pandemic to help schools improve air quality and reduce energy use while meeting classroom ventilation requirements. AB 841 directed the California Energy Commission (CEC), as program administrator, to design, administer, and implement the program. Pursuant to Public Utilities Code (PUC) Section 1615(e)(1), the CEC must return all unspent CalSHAPE Program funds to the electric and gas investor-owned utilities (IOU) by December 1, 2026. The CEC set an encumbrance deadline of October 31, 2024, for new grant agreements to ensure funds are reverted by this date. For administration purposes, the SEES Program is referred to as the "California Schools Healthy Air, Plumbing, and Efficiency (CalSHAPE) Program."

The CalSHAPE Program consists of two grant programs: the Ventilation Program and the Plumbing Program. The Ventilation Program provides funding for LEAs to assess, maintain, repair, and replace heating, ventilation, and air-conditioning (HVAC) systems in schools through two grant opportunities, the Assessment and Maintenance (A&M) Grant and the Upgrade and Repair (U&R) Grant. The A&M Grant provides filter replacement, installation of carbon dioxide monitors in each classroom, and testing of HVAC systems. The U&R Grant provides additional funding to LEAs that completed an A&M Grant for the repairs, upgrades, and replacements recommended by the licensed professional in the A&M reports. The Plumbing Program provides grants to LEAs and state agencies to replace aging and water-inefficient plumbing fixtures and appliances with water-conserving ones.

The CalSHAPE Program goals are to save energy, create jobs, and provide direct support to schools in underserved communities, as defined by statute. Both the Ventilation and the Plumbing Programs require a skilled and trained workforce perform the work to support the program goal of promoting high-quality jobs.<sup>1</sup> Both programs also limited eligibility of program awards to schools in underserved communities until August 2022, when eligibility was expanded to schools statewide.<sup>2</sup> As of the end of 2024, 45 percent of the grant funds were

awarded to LEAs for projects at schools in underserved communities. Information on workforce and the energy and water savings of the projects is beginning to be collected in the final reports submitted by LEAs and state agencies.

In 2024, the CEC issued the final grant awards and continues to collect and process final reports. This annual report describes CalSHAPE Program activities and spending in 2024 and summarizes expected program activities and budget in 2025.

## CHAPTER 2:

# Budget

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CalSHAPE Program funding comes from the energy efficiency budgets of California's large electric and gas IOUs, specifically Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E), Southern California Edison Company (SCE), San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E), and Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas). The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) approved the IOUs' energy efficiency budgets and authorized the transfer of funding to CEC for the CalSHAPE Program.<sup>3</sup> Total funding amounts transferred by each IOU are provided in Table 1.

In addition to the funds transferred by the IOUs pursuant to AB 841 and CPUC D. 21-01-004, the California Budget Act of 2022 allocated \$20 million to the Ventilation Program from the greenhouse gas reduction fund (GGRF).<sup>4</sup> These funds are restricted to funding the replacement of HVAC systems in schools, which is funded as part of the Ventilation Program U&R Grants. Additional information on the U&R Grants is provided in Chapter 3.

As shown in Table 2, the total program budget is nearly \$1.014 billion. The CEC may use up to \$31 million of the program budget for administering the programs as provided by PUC Section 1615(d) and Item 3360-001-3228 of the Budget Act of 2022. The amount available for grant awards is approximately \$983 million with 25 percent of the IOU funds (\$240.9 million)

allocated to the Plumbing Program and 75 percent of the IOU funds and all GGRF funds (\$741.9 million) allocated to the Ventilation Program.<sup>5</sup>

Pursuant to CPUC D. 21-01-044, the program must return any unused funds to each utility by December 1, 2026.<sup>6</sup>

PUC Section 1617 automatically deems the CalSHAPE programs cost-effective and specifies that the programs shall not be considered by the CPUC when calculating the overall cost-effectiveness of the IOUs' energy efficiency portfolios due to the current cost-effectiveness methodology not fully taking into account the indirect and nonmonetary public benefits.

Information on the awarded funding and current program budget is provided in Chapter 5.

# CHAPTER 3:

## Program Statistics

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The CalSHAPE Program was established with the goals of saving energy, creating jobs, and providing support to schools in underserved communities. The program also provides the added benefits of improving air quality and reducing water usage in California schools. This chapter describes the program activities and provides the statistics related to these benefits and the combined effect in achieving the overarching goals of the program.

### Program Activities

The CEC issued grant applications for both the Plumbing and Ventilation Programs in five funding rounds. The first funding round was issued in the fall of 2021 and, subsequently, four additional funding rounds were held in March 2022, June 2022, December 2022, and July 2023.

Program activities in 2024 consisted of completing a final grant application round, processing 266 applications, and issuing 177 awards to successful LEAs and state agencies for each of the programs. CEC also began reviewing final reports and invoices for completed plumbing and ventilation projects to close out grants.

### CalSHAPE Program Awards

California has approximately 2,000 LEAs with over 10,000 eligible schools, 6,300 of which are in underserved communities. Through the CalSHAPE program, the CEC has provided plumbing or ventilation improvement grants at 4,917 school sites -- 49 percent of all school sites in the state. The ventilation program will provide HVAC repair and replacement at 4,860 school sites with 3,303 MTCO<sub>2</sub>e in forecasted greenhouse gas emission reductions. The plumbing program grants will enable the replacement of aging and water inefficient plumbing fixtures at 1,489 schools, with an estimated 2.5 billion in water savings with 58,974 replacements.

Table 3 provides the number of grants to LEAs, number of school sites that will benefit, and the amount of grant funding awarded, along with the expected total budget and the percentage of the total budget awarded for each program as of the end of 2024. A list of LEAs that were awarded a CalSHAPE grant with information on the utility funding category, number of schools in underserved communities, and the award amount is provided in the Appendix.

CalSHAPE Program funding is distributed to LEAs on a first-come, first served basis within the application tier of the LEA and the funding category (IOU territory) of the school. The application tiers are based upon student enrollment and were created to encourage equity in the statewide distribution of program funds. The tiers are based on an approach used for the CEC’s Energy Conservation Assistance Act — Education Subaccount Competitive Loan Program. The three application tiers based on the LEA’s student enrollment with the percentage of funding allocated to each tier are as follows:

- Tier 1 (fewer than 1,000 students enrolled) – 10 percent funding allocation
- Tier 2 (between 1,000 and 5,000 students enrolled) – 10 percent funding allocation
- Tier 3 (more than 5,000 students enrolled) – 80 percent funding allocation

Based on statute, state agencies are eligible applicants for the plumbing program. CEC included them in Tier 3 based on public input received during the CalSHAPE guideline development process.

The CEC created funding categories to track funding received from each utility and ensure funds were awarded within the appropriate IOU service territory.<sup>7</sup> The program has six funding categories: one for each of the four IOUs, a second funding category for PG&E, and GGRF. The funds provided by and to PG&E electric and PG&E gas service territories are tracked separately to ensure the ratepayer money collected in the separate electric and gas service territories go toward projects in the specific service territory areas. The funds provided by SDG&E are not tracked separately for the electric and gas service territories because of the minimal number of schools in the SDG&E gas-only service territory.

The distribution of grant awards as of the end of 2024, and the total budget and number of eligible LEAs and schools by funding category are shown in Table 4. As shown, 80 percent of program funds have been awarded and most utility territories have an award rate of more than 90 percent. SDG&E is an outlier at 46 percent. Without the SDGE outlier, the program

awarded 88 percent of program funds. Staff believes the SDG&E uptake could be due to fewer eligible LEAs and school sites in SDG&E territory compared to PG&E, SoCalGas, or SCE.

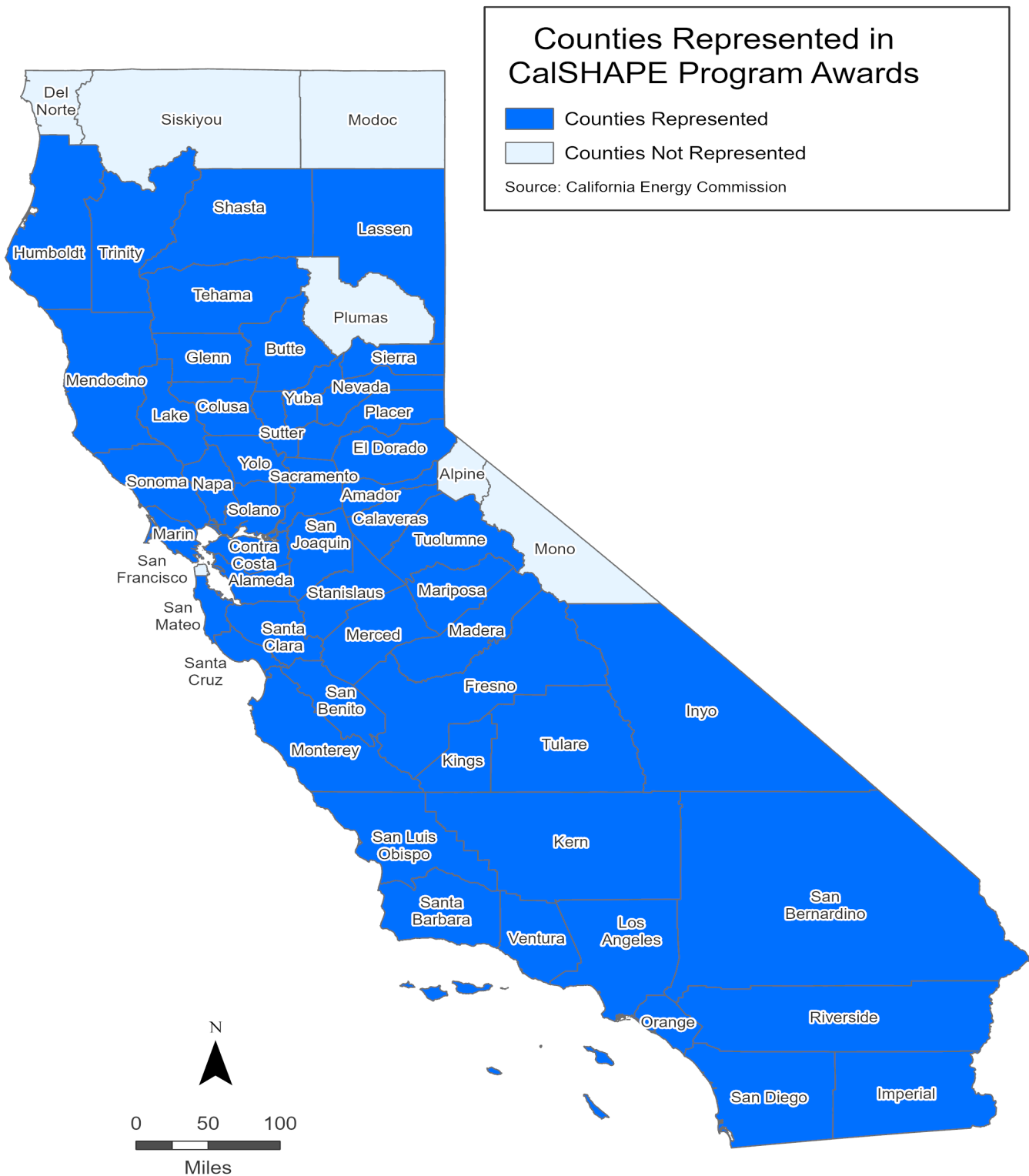
The distribution of CalSHAPE Program funds by funding category and application tier has promoted equity of funding and broadened the impact of program projects throughout the state.

The CalSHAPE Program awarded grants for either the Ventilation or Plumbing Program to LEAs located in 51 of the state’s 58 counties, which is 88 percent of the counties in the state. A map displaying the counties represented in the awards is shown in blue in Figure 1. The CalSHAPE Program requires that IOUs funds can only be awarded for projects in the IOU’s service territory.<sup>8</sup> The counties not represented in the CalSHAPE awards have either no or very few schools or state buildings in the IOUs service territory.

As part of the grant agreement, the CalSHAPE grantee is provided 24 months to complete all grant work with an optional 18-month project term extension. It is currently taking grantees an average of 16 months to complete the project work and data reporting. After this step has been completed, CalSHAPE Program grantees submit their final reports and invoices, collectively referred to as the “reconciliation report,” upon completion of their grant projects. Table 5 provides the number of grant awards and reconciliation reports submitted for each program along with the grant award amount and total funds that have been paid to LEAs as of December 2024.

The CEC has developed a comprehensive review process for final reports to ensure each project meets the program guidelines, grant agreement terms and conditions are fulfilled, and work performed provides a benefit to the LEA. A detailed description of the oversight and compliance process is provided in Chapter 4.

## **Schools in Underserved Communities**

Guiding legislation requires at least 25 percent of program funds to be provided to schools in underserved communities and that these schools be offered the chance to apply for a grant before other schools.<sup>9</sup> To fulfill this requirement, CEC limited grant eligibility in the first three funding rounds to schools in underserved communities. The eligibility was expanded to include schools near high traffic corridors and Title V facilities at the beginning of the third funding round.<sup>10</sup> This prioritization at the start of the program resulted in \$446 million, or 45 percent of the total program budget, being awarded to 781 LEAs for projects at schools in underserved communities.<sup>11</sup>

## **Ventilation Program**

As stated above, the CalSHAPE Ventilation Program includes two grant opportunities – an A&M Grant and a U&R Grant – and had a total budget of \$737.14 million. Both programs closed to new applications on July 1, 2024. To ensure projects funds are being spent appropriately, project work is being done in a quality manner and aligned with grant requirements, and the LEAs are receiving the benefits of this program, the CEC has a robust oversight and compliance process. A detailed description of the oversight and compliance process is provided in Chapter 4.

The A&M Grant funds various measures to improve indoor air quality in schools, including filter replacement; installation of carbon dioxide monitors in each classroom; assessment, maintenance, and repair of HVAC systems; and an HVAC assessment report. Table 7 provides the number of HVAC system assessments, filters, and carbon dioxide monitor installations requested in the applications as of the end of 2024. Actual installed numbers will be provided after projects are completed and final reports are submitted.

All LEAs receiving an A&M grant are required to use a qualified testing or adjusting personnel to gather data on each HVAC unit at a school site and submit this to the CEC in a HVAC assessment report. As of the end of 2024, 357 of the 782 required HVAC assessment reports have been submitted. Table 8 provides initial information reported on the number of HVAC systems assessed, recommended for repair or replacement by a licensed professional, and reported as meeting ventilation rates.

The second type of grant offered through the Ventilation Program is a U&R Grant. The U&R Grant provides additional funding to LEAs to make recommended repairs, upgrades, or replacements to all electric or hybrid HVAC systems with mixed fuel, depending on professional recommendations. An LEA may apply for a U&R Grant if they previously received a CalSHAPE A&M Grant and the CEC-approved HVAC assessment report includes a recommendation from a licensed professional to repair or replace the HVAC system. As with the A&M Grants, U&R Grants were awarded on a first-come, first-served basis to LEAs. Table 9 provides the number of all electric and hybrid heating systems requested in the U&R Grant applications.

## Plumbing Program

The CalSHAPE Plumbing Program funds the replacement of noncompliant plumbing fixtures and appliances with water-conserving ones in schools and state buildings. The noncompliant plumbing fixtures and appliances eligible for replacement are toilets, urinals, showerheads, interior faucets, automatic commercial ice makers, and commercial clothes washers and dishwashers. The water-conserving plumbing fixtures are required to meet current building standards and water-conserving appliances must meet the criteria of the ENERGY STAR ® Product Specifications.<sup>12</sup>

The CEC limited eligibility of the Plumbing Program in the first three funding rounds to schools in underserved communities, near busy roadways, and Title V facilities based on public input during the guideline development process. Based upon statutory direction, the eligibility of the Plumbing Program was expanded to include state agencies in 2022 at the start of funding round four.<sup>13</sup> As of the end of 2024, California State Universities Long Beach and Fullerton and Kern Community College were awarded a total of \$1.2 million in plumbing grants.

Table 11 provides the number of noncompliant plumbing fixture and appliance replacements that were requested in the applications, along with the estimated water savings of each type of fixture and appliance. As shown, the plumbing fixture and appliance replacements are estimated to reduce the total water usage of participating schools by 65 percent. The estimated water savings percentages were calculated based upon the flow or water usage

rates of the existing, noncompliant plumbing fixtures and appliances compared to the rates of new, water-saving fixtures and appliances.

## CHAPTER 4:

# Program Oversight

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The CEC has developed a comprehensive oversight process to ensure each project meets the program guidelines, grant agreement terms and conditions are fulfilled, and work performed provides a benefit to the LEA. Specific oversight actions by CEC includes outreach to LEAs on the progress of projects, coordinating with LEA and industry groups to ensure program requirements are clear, reviewing submitted reports and data for compliance with program requirements, contracting for technical assistance, and conducting audits of completed projects.

The compliance review of submitted reports verifies project, workforce requirements, and invoice requirements are met by the LEA. If issues or errors are found, CEC staff begins an iterative process with the LEA to discuss, correct, and resolve. Due to the different requirements of the Plumbing and Ventilation programs, the compliance process for each program is distinct and described in this Chapter. CEC staff will continue to update and revise the oversight and compliance processes as needed to ensure program requirements are met and goals are advanced.

### Ventilation Program

The ventilation program consists of A&M and U&R grants with each having unique but similar compliance processes.

**A&M.** The A&M Grant provides grants to LEAs for the assessment of HVAC systems, filter replacement, and installation of carbon dioxide monitors in each classroom. The LEA receives 50 percent of the grant upon award by CEC, 25 percent upon submittal of completed HVAC assessment report, and the final 25 percent upon CEC-approval of a reconciliation report detailing completed work and project costs.

The A&M Grant requires both an HVAC assessment report and a reconciliation report be submitted and approved.

The compliance process consists of the following:

- **Project Requirements:** The LEA must provide an HVAC assessment report for each HVAC unit that includes data on equipment specifications, as-found and newly installed filter, air flow, building pressurization, economizers, demand control ventilation, and the as-found and adjusted ventilation rate. The report must also be reviewed by a licensed professional who provides recommendations on repairs, upgrades, and replacements to correct deficiencies and meet the minimum ventilation and filtration rate requirements. To facilitate project review and verify the assessment and maintenance process was performed as required by the program guidelines and reported data is accurate, the CEC developed a data review tool using Microsoft® Power BI to view and analyze the

data and contracted with UC Davis Western Cooling Efficiency Center to assist in developing the analyses. If issues with accuracy of the data or the performance of the project are found, CEC staff conducts an iterative process with the LEA and contractor to discuss issues, correct and resubmit as needed, and resolve. For projects with many issues, the CEC audits the project. The audits include a meeting with the LEA and contractor to review the issues with the data, discuss the procedures used in the assessment and maintenance work, and determine the appropriate next steps to correct the data or project to ensure program requirements are met.

- **Workforce requirements:** As with the Plumbing Program, all construction work, which includes the carbon dioxide monitor installation, must be performed by a skilled and trained workforce. The HVAC assessment and filter installation must be performed by either an HVAC acceptance test technician or a testing, adjusting, and balancing (TAB) technician, and any adjustments to the HVAC system must be made by a TAB technician. In the HVAC assessment and reconciliation reports, LEAS must provide information on individuals that completed a project including certification. CEC staff reviews and verifies licenses and certification to confirm the skilled and trained workforce requirement is met.
- **Invoice requirements:** After a project is completed, the LEA is required to submit invoices and receipts with the reconciliation report. The invoices must include the contractor's information, total costs, itemized labor and material costs for the HVAC assessment, maintenance, and any repairs or replacements made using the contingency funding, and any purchase receipts. CEC staff confirms the costs and charges listed in the invoices and receipts are eligible costs.

**U&R.** The U&R Grant provides additional funding to LEAs that completed an A&M Grant for the repairs, upgrades, and replacements recommended by the licensed professional in the HVAC assessment report. The LEA receives 25 percent of the grant upon award by CEC, 50 percent upon request for reimbursement of incurred costs, and the final 25 percent upon CEC approval of a reconciliation report detailing completed work and project costs. The first of these grants were awarded in early 2024.

The compliance process consists of verifying:

- **Project Requirements:** The LEA must provide a project completion report that includes a description of project activities and outcomes and data on equipment specifications, newly installed filters, air flow, building pressurization, and ventilation rates. As with A&M grants, the CEC developed a data review tool using Microsoft® Power BI to view and analyze the data. If issues with accuracy of the data or the performance of the project are found, CEC staff conducts an iterative process with the LEA and contractor to discuss issues, correct and resubmit as needed, and resolve. For projects with many issues, CEC audits the project. The audits include a meeting with the LEA and contractor to review the issues and determine the appropriate next steps to correct the data or project to ensure program requirements are met.

- **Workforce requirements:** As with the plumbing and A&M grants, all construction work must be performed by a skilled and trained workforce. In the reconciliation reports, LEAs must provide information on individuals that completed a project including certification information. CEC staff reviews and verifies license and certification to confirm the skilled and trained workforce requirement is met.
- **Invoice requirements:** Similar to the plumbing and A&M grants, after a project is completed, the LEA is required to submit invoices and receipts with the reconciliation report. The invoices must include the contractor's information, total costs, itemized labor and material costs for the repairs, replacements, and any work made using the contingency funding, and purchase receipts. CEC staff confirm the make and model of the installed HVAC systems on the receipts match that reported in the reconciliation report and confirms the costs and charges listed in the invoices and receipts are eligible costs.

## **Plumbing Program**

The Plumbing Program provides grants to LEAs and state agencies to replace aging and water-inefficient plumbing fixtures and appliances with water-conserving plumbing fixtures and appliances in schools and state buildings. The LEA receives 50 percent of the grant upon request for reimbursement of incurred costs and the final 50 percent upon CEC-approval of a final reconciliation report.

The compliance process consists of the CEC verifying:

- **Project Requirements:** The program provides funding for LEAs to bring plumbing fixtures and appliances up to current flow rates and ENERGY STAR ® Product Specifications requirements. CEC staff verify project requirements are met using information on plumbing fixtures and appliances provided in the application and the final reconciliation report. The make, model, and water usage information of the noncompliant plumbing fixtures and appliances are collected in the grant application to confirm these items are eligible for replacement. The make, model and water usage of the newly installed water-conserving plumbing fixtures and appliances are required to be reported in the reconciliation report and supported with project invoices to ensure the project was completed with eligible equipment and will result in water savings for the participating school or state building.
- **Workforce requirements:** All construction work must be performed by a skilled and trained workforce, which means that at least 60 percent of the skilled journeypersons performing the plumbing fixture and appliance replacement work must be graduates of an apprenticeship program for plumbers. In reconciliation reports, LEAS must provide information on individuals that completed a project including apprentice certification. CEC staff reviews this information and confirms the skilled and trained workforce requirement is met.



- Invoice requirements: After a project is completed, the grantee is required to submit invoices and receipts with the reconciliation report. The invoices must include contractor's information, total costs, itemized labor and material costs for the replacement of each type of plumbing fixture or appliance, and purchase receipts. CEC staff confirm the make and model of the installed plumbing fixtures and appliances on the receipts match that reported in the reconciliation report and reported costs are eligible costs. The CEC audits invoices and receipts to confirm the invoiced costs are within a certain range of average costs and performs on-site audits for projects with costs that exceed the average range. The on-site audit includes a meeting with the LEA and contractor to view the installed plumbing fixtures and appliances, review paperwork, and determine the appropriate next steps to correct the requested reimbursement amount, if needed.

## CHAPTER 5:

# 2025 Outlook and Conclusion

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The CalSHAPE Program was authorized in 2020 to re-open schools and improve indoor air quality. The CalSHAPE Program has awarded almost \$789 million, or 89 percent of program budget, in grants to 647 LEAs and 3 state agencies. This provides for 1,114 plumbing or ventilation improvement projects at 4,917 school sites -- 49 percent of all school sites in the state.

The final funding round for the Plumbing and Ventilation Programs closed on May 31, 2024 and July 1, 2024, respectively. All applications have been reviewed, awards issued, and agreements between CEC and LEAs or state agencies have been executed. CEC does not expect to issue any new founding rounds or awards.

LEAs and state agencies have two years to complete the grant-funded work and submit final documents. The final agreements term date is October 31, 2026. CEC is currently providing oversight, verifying compliance, and analyzing data. CEC plans to continue to provide oversight and implement program improvements as we approach the funding balance return date of December 1, 2026 and program sunset date of January 1, 2027.

As described in Chapter 2, CalSHAPE Program funding comes from the four IOUs and state GGRF. As shown in Table 12, which provides a snapshot of CalSHAPE Program balances, the CEC expects to return approximately \$194 million in unused ratepayer funds to the IOUs by December 2026. The actual amount of returned funds may be larger if LEAs do not use all awarded funds.
