Dear Commissioners,

Thank you for your thoughtful attention to the Corby Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) Project and for exploring alternative locations. I'm writing as a local resident and parent who deeply values both safety and the preservation of our community's farmland.

I strongly urge the Commission to direct NextEra to move the Corby BESS Project to the Lambie Industrial Park. This location makes far more sense—it's zoned for industrial use, safely distanced from homes and schools, and aligns with Solano County's updated BESS Ordinance. It's the responsible, forward-thinking choice that allows renewable energy progress to continue without sacrificing the agricultural land that defines our region.

The current Corby site, however, puts too much at risk. Using protected farmland for industrial development goes against the County's long-term vision and Measure T's intent. It introduces unnecessary danger—if a thermal-runaway fire were to occur, the impact on nearby neighborhoods and the I-80 corridor could be devastating.

Even NextEra has acknowledged that the Lambie site is feasible. The only objections they've raised involve relatively minor delays or paperwork issues that are insignificant compared to the long-term safety of our residents and protection of valuable farmland.

Please stand with the community and require that this project be placed where it belongs—at the Lambie Industrial Park. Thank you for listening and for continuing to make decisions that keep Solano County safe and sustainable.
