## **Relocation of BESS project would meet local ordinances**

Subject: Urging Relocation of the Proposed Corby BESS Project to Lambie Industrial Park

Dear Commissioners,

I respectfully urge the California Energy Commission to instruct NextEra Energy to relocate the proposed Corby Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) project to a much safer and more suitable location at Lambie Industrial Park.

This relocation would be consistent with Solano County's Measure T, which reflects the community's clear intent to protect public safety, preserve agricultural resources, and ensure responsible land use. Lambie Industrial Park is already zoned for industrial development, providing the necessary infrastructure and safety buffers that are appropriate for a large-scale energy storage facility.

Moving the project to this industrial area would greatly reduce public safety risks, as it is located away from rural homes, agricultural wells, and farmland operations. It would also protect prime agricultural land, which is vital to the county's economy and food production, while ensuring full compliance with existing county and city ordinances that restrict industrial uses on agricultural-zoned property.

By directing NextEra to evaluate and select Lambie Industrial Park as the preferred site, the CEC would be supporting a solution that aligns with both local land-use policy and state renewable energy goals, without compromising safety or agricultural integrity.

Thank you for your careful consideration of this request and for upholding the principles of community safety and responsible energy development in Solano County.
