Carol Watson, CEC, coordinated via telephone and discussed Valley Water's riparian mitigation plantings mentioned in the comment letter (TN: 249099) (Carol Watson requested a map be provided if available) also species planted, duration, monitoring regime, and associated wildlife species, etc. Also, CEC staff mentioned they would like to review Valley Water's recommended mitigation measures (Water Resources Protection Collaborative Design Guides 2 and 3 which are related to landscaping adjacent to creeks and the riparian corridor) to be sure that they understand the measures fully.

Lisa has a GIS layer that shows plantings in the area; she will coordinate with her staff biologists on above questions per today's phone call.

See the responses from our biologist below in green.

Questions regarding our mitigation areas adjacent to the project site. They would like to know:

- 1. What plants were planted in the mitigation areas adjacent to the site? Fremont cottonwood, arroyo willow, mulefat, narrowleaf willow, creeping wildrye
- 2. Where exactly are the mitigation areas and how big are they? (I'm not sure how accurately our mitigation areas are shown in GIS). Approximately 900-foot-long/2-acre planting area on the southwest bank of the river, just upstream of Hwy 101. See attached maps. (Our mitigation areas in GIS should be reliably accurate.)
- 3. What is the monitoring regime? Monitoring of this mitigation planting area was completed in 2015, and included several years of planting survival, health and vigor, natural recruitment, native and nonnative cover.
- 4. When were they planted? 2002, maybe 2001
- 5. Were there any associated wildlife species associated with the mitigation areas? Wildlife monitoring was not required or conducted, but the mitigation was intended to help compensate for impacts to special-status species.


