#### COMMENTS:

CEC consultant, Collin Crawford-Martin, spoke with Manu Singh, owner of the Shell gas station located adjacent to the project's southwestern corner. Mr. Crawford-Martin asked Mr. Singh to provide details of the residents living in the area near the project and Mr. Singh explained that there are around 40 to 50 people that camp out during certain times of the year and on a few different private properties located about 4.5 to 5 miles down Rasor Rd from I-15.

Regarding the residents that live on his properties adjacent to the site, there are around six to eight individuals living in four households. Three of those households, he explained, were low-income. Out of the four households, approximately three have individuals living there that consider themselves to be non-white, per the US Census categories.
