Dear Ms. Huber, Ms. Vorters, and Mr. Veerkamp,

This letter is submitted on behalf of the Center for Biological Diversity (“Center”) and Communities for a Better Environment (“CBE”) to request to be mailed and e-mailed notice of the availability of any environmental review document, prepared pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act, related to the Vernon Backup Generating Facility (PD25-012) (“Project”) proposed by GIC Vernon, LLC (“Applicant”), as well as a copy of the environmental review document when it is made available for public review. The Center and CBE also request to be mailed and e-mailed notice of any and all hearings and/or actions related to the Project. These requests are made pursuant to Public Resources Code Sections 21092.2, 21080.4, 21083.9, 21092, 21108, 21152 and 21167(f) and Government Code Section 65092, which require local agencies to mail such notices to any person who has filed a written request for them with the clerk of the agency’s governing body.

The Center is a non-profit, public interest environmental organization dedicated to environmental protection. The Center has over 1.8 million members and online activists throughout California and the United States, including in the area to be impacted by the Project. The Center has worked for many years to protect air and water quality and overall quality of life for people throughout California, including in Los Angeles County.

Likewise, CBE has worked with community residents in Southeast Los Angeles for over 30 years with its main office in Southern California located in Huntington Park, just two miles from the proposed project site. CBE is concerned about the addition of significant amounts of unstudied and unmitigated pollution in an already pollution-burdened, low-income community where the region is made up of over 92 percent residents that identify as Latine. CBE's mission is to build people power in California's communities of color and low-income communities to achieve environmental health and justice by preventing and reducing pollution and building green, healthy, sustainable communities and environments
