Dear Mike Hartley:

To support the implementation of California's Energy Code (Title 24, Part 6), Acceptance Test Technician Certification Providers (ATTCPs) are approved by the California Energy Commission (CEC) to train, certify, and oversee the technicians who perform required tests for lighting controls and mechanical systems in nonresidential buildings. The Energy Code also allows the CEC's Executive Director to approve certain ATTCP application amendments if the amendments are considered non-substantive, pursuant to Section 10-103.2(f)1A, and found consistent with the requirements of Section 10-103.2.

On January 14, 2026, the CEC received an application from California State Pipe Trades Council (CSPTC) to amend their application as an approved ATTCP. The proposed amendments update the mechanical acceptance test certification and recertification exams by adjusting the total number of test questions. These non-substantive changes preserve the previously approved passing threshold while incorporating updated exam content.

CEC staff has reviewed the proposed changes and determined that CSPTC's application would remain in compliance with the Energy Code requirements if these changes were implemented. Upon review of the regulatory requirements outlined in Title 24, Part 6, Section 10-103.2, CEC staff agrees with CSPTC that the application amendment is non-substantive pursuant to Section 10-103.2(f)1A of the 2025 Energy Code. CEC staff has determined that the application amendment is complete with all supporting information required pursuant to Section 10-103.2(f)1A.
