## **Allow us to comment on the draft SB 100 report**

I strongly object to the CEC sending the final report to the Commissioners for approval without a chance for public comment on a draft report. The public deserves to see how staff has responded to the many comments about the inaccurate and incomplete slide presentations.

Furthermore, we need to see the details of how you are incorporating behind the meter solar and storage, especially using the current 18.5 MWh of EV batteries (expected to triple by 2045).

We also want to see your detailed recommended policy changes to get residential and commercial rooftop solar expansion back on track (after the CPUC NEM 3 decimated it).

Classifying Carbon Capture and Sequestration of natural gas power plants as 95% zero carbon power source is so ridiculous that it should be dropped, rather than embarrass the agencies.

Similarly, proposing to perpetuate natural gas use in power plants by adding some percentage of hydrogen is also an insult to the legislature that passed SB 100.

Please fix these and many other problems and show us a new draft report.
