On May 8, 2026, Lahontan Regional Water Quality Control Board (LRWQCB) staff provided comments seeking minor editorial revisions ([TN 269908](#)) to conditions proposed within the Mojave Solar Project (09-AFC-05C) CEC Staff Analysis for the Petition to Amend the Final Commission Decision to Install Two New Evaporation Ponds, docketed on April 9, 2026.

The changes set forth below to the Staff Analysis ([TN 269451](#)) are necessary to clarify that the waste discharge requirements (WDRs) contain enforceable requirements that fully protect water quality and are consistent with laws, ordinances, regulations, and statutes (LORS). Incorporating explicit references to proper operation and maintenance, including adequate laboratory controls, quality assurance procedures, and the use of backup systems when needed, strengthens the license ability to ensure continuous compliance with the WDRs. Additionally, tying the WDRs directly to the definitions of nuisance, contamination, and pollution in Water Code section 13050 ensures consistency with LORS. Deleted text is shown in ~~strikethrough~~ and new text is shown as **bold underline**.

Attachment B, section II.7, is revised as follows:

The Applicant must always properly operate and maintain all facilities and systems of treatment and control (and related appurtenances) that are installed or used to achieve compliance with the WDRs. Proper operation and maintenance include adequate laboratory control, ~~where appropriate,~~ and appropriate quality-assurance procedures. This ~~provision~~ **obligation** requires the operation of backup or auxiliary facilities or similar systems ~~that are installed by the Applicant,~~ when necessary to achieve **maintain** compliance with the conditions of the WDRs. **All activities and waste discharges associated with the Facility must be conducted in a manner that does not cause, or threaten to cause, a nuisance, contamination or pollution as defined in Water Code section 13050.**
