The California Energy Commission (CEC) will host a workshop to discuss key topics, specifically the Transportation Fuels Assessment (TFA) scope overview and resupply planning. The current TFA requirements were established under Senate Bill (SB) X1-2 (Stats. 2023, 1st Ex. Sess. 2023-2024, Ch. 1), later amended by Assembly Bill (AB) X2-1 (Stats. 2024, 2nd Ex. Sess. 2023-2024, Ch.1) and further amended by Senate Bill 237 (Stats 2025. Ch. 119). The Refinery Resupply planning requirements were established by Assembly Bill X2-1 (Stats. 2024, 2nd Ex. Sess. 2023–2024, Ch. 1) and build on the refinery reporting and transparency framework created by Senate Bill X1-2 (Stats. 2023, 1st Ex. Sess. 2023–2024, Ch. 1).

SB X1-2 and AB X2-1 require the CEC to assess transportation fuel prices, supply conditions, and reliability in California. AB X2-1 further requires the CEC to consider the effects of refiners' inventories of fuel, feedstock, and blending components on transportation fuel prices, and

authorizes the CEC to consider ways to minimize the impacts of maintenance-related production losses on fuel prices while protecting the health and safety of workers, local communities, and the public.

The CEC aims to begin promptly at the start time posted and the end time is an estimate based on the proposed agenda. The workshop may end sooner or later than the posted end time.

A quorum of Commissioners and Independent Consumer Fuels Advisory Committee members may participate, but no votes will be taken.

Agenda

This workshop will provide an opportunity for CEC staff and stakeholders to engage in substantive discussion on two core topic areas under consideration: the second TFA and refinery resupply planning. The purpose of this workshop is to facilitate open dialogue on the scope, framing, and key considerations associated with each of these topics prior to the development of any formal staff analysis or draft regulatory proposals.

The workshop is intended to identify relevant issues, gather stakeholder perspectives, and inform the direction of further staff work on the TFA and resupply planning. The proceeding aims to discuss ways in which to protect consumers from gasoline price spikes, strengthen supply reliability, and build a comprehensive public record to guide decisions. The workshop will include a public comment period.

Background

AB X2-1, which took effect on January 13, 2025, builds on Senate Bill (SB) X1-2, which established the California Energy Commission's Transportation Fuels Assessment (TFA) framework to improve transparency into the petroleum industry and help protect consumers from price spikes. AB X2-1 amended that framework by requiring the CEC to consider the effects of refiners' inventories of fuel, feedstock, and blending components on transportation fuel prices in California, and by authorizing the CEC to develop requirements for refiners to plan for resupply of lost production during planned maintenance or turnarounds and to evaluate reserve margin frameworks to support fuel supply stability.

CEC is hosting this workshop as part of the broader Petroleum Supply Stabilization proceeding to explore strategies for maintaining a safe, reliable fuel supply as California transitions away from petroleum. As authorized under the Petroleum Industry Information Reporting Act, as amended by SB X1-2 and AB X2-1, the proceedings will evaluate California's fuel supply landscape and Resupply

Planning to ensure refiners can address production losses during planned maintenance or turnarounds.

The goal of this workshop is to create a transparent forum where interested members of the public and stakeholders can share input and data, surface key questions and considerations, and help build a clear public record prior to any regulatory action being considered. With refining capacity declining faster than demand, the state faces heightened risks of price spikes and supply disruptions. This workshop is a proactive step to protect consumers, support economic stability, and ensure that future staff analysis and decisions on the TFA and resupply planning are grounded in evidence and based on broad engagement with members of the public.
