***Subject: CSPTC Annual Report of the California State Pipe Trades Mechanical Acceptance Test Technician Certification Provider to the California Energy Commission***

California Energy Commission,

The California State Pipe Trades Council (CSPTC) was approved as an Acceptance Test Technician Certification Provider (ATTCP) for non-Residential Mechanical Acceptance Test Technicians and Employers on September 14, 2016.

We have approved Local Union Training Centers in San Francisco, Santa Rosa, Fresno, Los Angeles, Concord, San Jose, and Sacramento that are currently teaching the curriculum outlined in the latest update submitted by the California State Pipe Trades Council and approved by the California Energy Commission.

In the year 2025, we certified or re-certified 89 Mechanical Acceptance Test Technicians (MATTs). 47 MATT Certifications lapsed in 2024. 114 MATTs certified or re-certified in 2024. As of December 31, 2025, we had 266 Certified MATTs.

In the year 2025 we certified or re-certified 15 Mechanical Acceptance Test Employers (MATEs). 9 Certifications lapsed in 2024. As of December 31, 2025, we had 37 Certified MATEs.

We continue to be proactive in seminars being conducted to bring contractors up to speed on the Title 24 CA Energy Code regarding Acceptance Test Technician Certification Providers for Non-Residential Mechanical Acceptance Test Technician Employers. Seminars are held on a quarterly basis.

Independent oversight of the certification processes and procedures are administered by NITC. For the year of January 1 to December 31, 2025, NITC flagged nine (9) form submissions from CSPTC certified Technicians for follow-up. Desk audits are anticipated on these flagged submissions in 2026.
