Commissioners re: Docket 24-OIR-03,

The financial burden this proposal would place on small C-20 contractors is significant and concerning. Requiring additional annual reporting would increase operating costs for businesses that are already managing tight margins, while also creating additional administrative strain for our own company.

Rather than adding more reporting requirements, we should be focusing on making California's permitting process more efficient and streamlined. If compliance is a concern, it would be more productive to examine the root causes of noncompliance. Is the permitting process straightforward, or are contractors waiting weeks for approvals? During those delays, are jobs being completed by unlicensed installers while homeowners purchase equipment from retailers like Home Depot or Amazon and hire individuals who may not be qualified or properly licensed to perform the installation?

Addressing inefficiencies in the permitting process would likely improve compliance more effectively than imposing additional reporting requirements on licensed contractors who are already striving to follow the laws. Dick Krueger
