- 3. Neither Mission Rock Energy Center, LLC (Applicant) nor the Energy Commission Staff (Staff) filed opposition to the Petition.
- 4. Petitioner's interests are relevant to the above-captioned proceeding.
- Petitioner has demonstrated a bona fide interest in the project and has demonstrated possession of information and expertise that will help the Committee in preparing a proposed decision.
- 6. Intervention is granted in the Committee's discretion to the degree that it finds

intervention reasonable and relevant. The Presiding Member or Committee may impose conditions on all intervenors' participation in the hearings in order to promote the orderly conduct of the proceeding.

THEREFORE, the Committee **ORDERS** that the Petition to Intervene in this matter be **GRANTED** and that Petitioner be placed upon the Proof of Service List as an Intervenor. Petitioner may exercise the rights and shall fulfill the obligations of a party as set forth in all orders issued in this matter and California Code of Regulations, title 20, section 1212. The deadlines for conducting discovery³ and other matters, including the Evidentiary Hearing, shall not be extended or changed by the granting of this Petition.⁴

We further ORDER that the Petitioner's participation is limited to the following topic areas: ALTERNATIVES, AIR QUALITY, SOIL & WATER RESOURCES, BIOLOGICAL RESOURCES, CULTURAL RESOURCES, VISUAL RESOURCES, and SOCIOECONOMICS/ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE. Petitioner's intervention is subject to further modification at the discretion of the Presiding Member or the Committee. These limitations of Petitioner's participation as an intervenor do not affect its ability to make public comments in the proceeding.

As an Intervenor, Petitioner is required to file and serve documents on other parties and to follow the Energy Commission's procedures and orders regarding presenting witnesses and evidence.

Petitioner is further required to review the "Revised General Orders Regarding Electronic Document Formats, Electronic Filing and Service of Documents and Other Matters," the rules regarding filings, the rules of evidence that apply at the evidentiary hearings, the rules prohibiting off-the-record contacts with Commissioners or the Hearing Officer about the merits of a project, and the rules about filing data requests.

PETITIONER'S FAILURE TO FULFILL THESE RESPONSIBILITIES MAY RESULT IN THE COMMITTEE LIMITING OR PRECLUDING PETITIONER'S PARTICIPATION IN THE PROCEEDINGS.
