## **ORDER SUSPENDING COMMENT PERIOD ON PRELIMINARY STAFF ASSESSMENT PUBLISHED NOVEMBER 27, 2017**

### **Introduction**

On December 30, 2015, Mission Rock Energy Center, LLC (Applicant) submitted an Application for Certification (Application) to the California Energy Commission (Energy Commission) seeking permission to construct and operate a 275-megawatt (MW) natural-gas-fired power generation facility, the Mission Rock Energy Center (Proposed Project).<sup>1</sup>

The Energy Commission assigned a committee of two Commissioners<sup>2</sup> (Committee) to conduct proceedings on the Application.

### **Background**

On November 27, 2017, Energy Commission staff (Staff) published the Preliminary Staff Assessment for the Proposed Project and provided a 60-day comment period deadline of January 26, 2018 in its Request for Comments.<sup>3</sup> On December 19, 2017, the Santa Paula Alliance filed a request for the Committee to extend the comment period on the Preliminary Staff Assessment beyond the “wet” season.<sup>4</sup> The request was made to allow additional time for the local government and community affected by and/or focused on combatting and recovering from the large-scale Thomas Fire and

subsequent mudslides to review and provide comments on the Preliminary Staff Assessment. The Committee sought input from the public and other interested parties about an extension and, if one were granted, an appropriate length of time.<sup>5</sup>

In response, the Committee heard from members of the public, the city of Santa Paula, Ventura County, two members of the state legislature, and Intervenor Wishtoyo Chumash Foundation. These responses all favored an extension, ranging from 60 to 90 days after the January 26, 2018, deadline established by Staff in the notice of availability.<sup>6</sup>

In the Applicant's January 2, 2018 Status Report, they supported a 30-day extension to February 26, 2018.<sup>7</sup>

Staff responded to the Committee's request by noting that the January 26, 2018 comment deadline reflects an extension of the minimum 30-day Preliminary Staff Assessment comment period to 60 days due to the holiday season. Staff further recommended the Committee extend the comment period to March 26, 2018, for a total of 120 days.<sup>8</sup> Staff also commented that they tentatively plan to hold a Preliminary Staff Assessment workshop on February 15 and 16, 2018, in Santa Paula and would provide at least 14 days' written notice of the workshop.

The Preliminary Staff Assessment is designed to provide Staff's independent assessment of a project's compliance with applicable laws, ordinances, regulations, and standards; mitigation of identified environmental impacts; and the safety and reliability of the proposed project.<sup>9</sup> Staff identified in the Preliminary Staff Assessment eight review areas that either may not comply with all applicable laws, ordinances, regulations, and standards; sufficiently mitigate impacts; and/or require additional information.<sup>10</sup> Due to the lack of current information and outstanding questions needed for a full analysis, the Preliminary Staff Assessment may require supplementation and re-issuance in order to allow comment on all topics encompassed within it.

The Committee notes and appreciates the work done by Staff in publishing the Preliminary Staff Assessment within the time set by the Committee's Second Revised Scheduling Order.<sup>11</sup> The Committee respects the time spent by the parties and other interested persons in reviewing and commenting on the Preliminary Staff Assessment and want to optimize that effort, if possible.

Based on the impact of the Thomas Fire and subsequent mudslides on the local community and Staff's need for additional information, the Committee believes a

suspension of the Preliminary Staff Assessment's formal comment period is appropriate at this time. By suspending formal commenting, we encourage Staff to proceed with the Preliminary Staff Assessment workshop tentatively planned for February 15 and 16, 2018, as this workshop may provide some of the information currently needed by Staff to supplement their analysis. While parties and the public are free to submit comments on the Preliminary Staff Assessment currently filed, and are encouraged to do so, it may be beneficial to wait until some of the outstanding questions and issues identified by Staff are resolved and a new Preliminary Staff Assessment reissued.

Further, given the need for more information for the Preliminary Staff Assessment and the unknown amount of time needed to receive this information, the Committee will be issuing a new scheduling order. Staff, the other parties, and the public are requested to provide a list or description of the most important pieces of information needed to supplement and reissue Staff's analysis, as well as the estimated time when this information will be available. The parties are requested to submit such comments **on or before February 28, 2018**.
