Background

Energy Commission staff published the *Comprehensive Energy Efficiency Program for Existing Buildings Scoping Report* in August 2012, and held workshops in October 2012 to receive public comments. Staff evaluated and considered stakeholder comments in the *Draft Action Plan for the Comprehensive Energy Efficiency Program for Existing Buildings*. This original draft was presented during three public workshops held across the state on June, 24, 25, and 28, 2013. Additional stakeholder input was received and

considered into the current draft which was released on March 6, 2015, and is available at: <http://www.energy.ca.gov/2015publications/CEC-400-2015-013/CEC-400-2015-013-D.pdf>. Workshops were held on April 7, 2015 and April 14, 2015. The April 7 workshop provided an overview of the draft *Action Plan* while the April 14 workshop provided details into strategies related to data for improved decisions.

The *Action Plan* provides a 10-year roadmap to dramatically increase energy efficiency in existing buildings. The *Action Plan* is consistent with Governor Edmund G. Brown Jr.'s goal to double efficiency in California's existing buildings by 2030. The Energy Commission will partner with the California Public Utilities Commission, local governments, industry stakeholders, and various state and local agencies to work towards achieving the *Action Plan's* objectives.

Agenda

The morning session of this workshop will focus on benchmarking experiences as a market driver to advance energy efficiency in existing buildings. Speakers will include representatives from the Institute for Market Transformation, agencies that have implemented public benchmarking, and industry. The afternoon session will focus on the role of local government leadership in achieving the *Action Plan's* goals. Local government representatives will discuss successes and challenges at the local level for advancing energy efficiency in the existing building stock.

The discussion of benchmarking at this workshop is limited to the role of benchmarking under the Action Plan. 
