#### COMMITTEE SCHEDULING ORDER

## Background

On April 29 and May 2, 2014, Carlsbad Energy Center LLC (the Petitioner), an indirect wholly owned subsidiary of NRG Energy, Inc., submitted two petitions to amend the May 31, 2012, Energy Commission Decision approving the Carlsbad Energy Center Project (CECP). The approved CECP and the amendment petitions are described below. The CECP would be located on the eastern portion of the Encina Power Station (EPS), north of Canon Road, east of the AT&SF/North County Transit District Rail Corridor, west of Interstate-5 and south of the Agua Hedionda Lagoon, in the city of Carlsbad in San Diego County.

The Energy Commission assigned this Committee of two Commissioners to conduct proceedings on the amendment. The Committee held a public Site Visit, Environmental Scoping Meeting, and Informational Hearing in Carlsbad on August 7, 2014, to discuss the review process and to identify issues that could affect the schedule. The Committee met in closed session on August 25, 2014 to deliberate on various matters, including the schedule.<sup>1</sup>

#### **Schedule**

The attached Committee Schedule is based on Staff's proposed schedule and related discussions at the Informational Hearing. The Committee may modify the schedule at any time upon either its own motion or that of a party. Cal. Code Regs., tit. 20, § 1709.7 (c).

#### **Status Reports and Status Conferences**

The attached schedule requires status reports to be submitted by all parties. Those status reports shall inform the Committee whether or not case development is

progressing satisfactorily, and bring potential schedule delays and other relevant matters to the Committee's attention.

## **Status Reports and Status Conferences**

The attached schedule requires status reports to be submitted by all parties. Those status reports shall inform the Committee whether or not case development is progressing satisfactorily, and bring potential schedule delays and other relevant matters to the Committee's attention.

### **Formality of Hearings**

The Committee intends to conduct the hearings on Staff's assessment and recommendations using an informal procedure. The parties will identify witnesses and exhibits prior to the hearing. During the hearing, all of the witnesses for a topic will be seated as a panel to answer questions from the parties and the Committee. While a question can be directed to a particular witness in the first instance, the other panelists may also answer the question if they choose. Panelists may also ask questions of each other. This format provides a more coherent discussion of the issues that is easier for the parties, public and the Committee to follow. The Committee does, however, reserve the right to convert to a more formal process for any issues.

#### **Public Adviser and Public Participation**

The Energy Commission invites members of the public and other interested parties to participate either on an informal basis or by intervening in the proceeding. Both types of participation allow written and oral comments. At the informal participation level, written and oral public comments are considered by the Commissioners and are part of the record, but are not part of the formal evidentiary record. Intervenors have the right to introduce evidence into the evidentiary record and cross-examine the other parties' witnesses.
