## Notice of IEPR Commissioner Workshop on Integrated Resource Plans – Light-Duty Vehicle Sector

The California Energy Commission Lead Commissioner for the *2017 Integrated Energy Policy Report* (IEPR) will conduct a workshop to discuss the publicly owned utilities (POUs) procurement plans for transportation electrification. Transportation electrification is a required element of the Integrated Resource Plans (IRPs) as specified in Senate Bill 350, the Clean Energy and Pollution Reduction Act (de León, Chapter 547, Statutes of 2015). POUs must submit their IRPs to the Energy Commission by January 2019.

Chair Robert B. Weisenmiller, the Lead IEPR Commissioner, and Commissioner Janea A. Scott, the Lead Commissioner on transportation, will conduct the workshop. California Public Utilities Commissioner (CPUC) Carla Peterman may also attend. Other Commissioners from the Energy Commission and the CPUC may also attend and participate in the workshop. A quorum of Commissioners from the CPUC and/or the Energy Commission may be in attendance, but no votes will be taken.

### Background

Senate Bill 350 (SB 350) requires California's POUs with annual electricity demand exceeding 700 gigawatt hours to develop and adopt IRPs by January 1, 2019. The IRPs must discuss how each POU

plans to meet greenhouse gas reduction targets established by the California Air Resources Board, and identify procurement plans of at least 50 percent renewable energy resources by 2030. SB 350 requires that the POU IRPs also address their procurement plans for electrification of the transportation sector within their service territory. The IRPs must be submitted to the Energy Commission to review for consistency with the legislative requirements. To facilitate review of the IRPs, SB 350 authorizes the Energy Commission to adopt guidelines that will provide a framework for the information and data to be submitted by POU.

The purpose of this workshop is to provide the Energy Commission, POU, and other stakeholders an opportunity to discuss transportation electrification for the light-duty vehicle sector. The workshop will support the Energy Commission in developing IRP guidelines specific to transportation electrification, provide an opportunity for POU and other stakeholders to provide input and inform the development of the guidelines, and to discuss and comment on the transportation electrification section of the Energy Commission's [draft staff paper](#) *Proposed Guideline Topics for Publicly Owned Utilities' Integrated Resource Plans*.

## Agenda

The workshop will include presentations and panel discussions related to the transportation electrification IRP requirements, with a focus on the light-duty vehicle sector. There will be presentations and panel discussions that include representatives from state government, POU, and other industry stakeholders. Specifically, representatives will discuss California's transportation electrification policies, scenarios for future penetration of zero emission vehicles, interconnecting high power charging loads, and POU activities to plan for and facilitate light-duty electric vehicle adoption.

**Oral Comments:** Commissioners will accept oral comments during the workshop. Public comments may be limited to three minutes or less per speaker. Any comments will become part of the public record in this proceeding.
