Re: Willow Pass Generating Station (Willow Pass)

The East County NAACP & Pittsburg's Black Political Association have serious concerns about the proposed **Willow Pass Generation Station**, its location and its potential negative impact upon our city.

Pittsburg is a heavily populated minority community. Within this community, there already two other sites, which could bring both present or future harm to its citizens: The John Mansfield Toxic Wastes Site, located at the Southern end of Harbor Street; The Pittsburg Transfer Station, also known as the "Dump;" These two sites, we conclude, were located in Pittsburg because of its heavily concentrated minority community. Furthermore, these two sites are located within two miles of the proposed Willow Pass Generation Station Site.

And now we have discovered this proposed **Willow Pass Generating Station**, another project having a location right in backyard of a minority community. We ask that the Commission deny and permanently suspend the applicant's application for certification. The placement and the impact that this project will have on our community force both of our organizations to raise the issue of environmental justice.
