Project Description: The project is a proposal for statewide regulations to establish or amend the levels of efficiency required for televisions which are not covered by federal appliance efficiency standards. The required new efficiency standards apply to newly manufactured products and are attainable through normal manufacturing processes. No material changes in how televisions are manufactured or constructed are expected to result from these new regulations. However it is expected that there will be a reduction of up to 30 percent in the use of mercury-containing fluorescent lamps used in the more efficient Liquid Crystal Display (LCD) televisions.

The proposed regulations which are the project for purposes of the study are contained in: Proposed Amendments to Appliance Efficiency Regulations (Express Terms), California Code of Regulations, Title 20, Sections 1601 through 1608, September 18, 2009 Appliance Efficiency Rulemaking, Phase 1, Part C, Docket Number 09-AAER-1C.



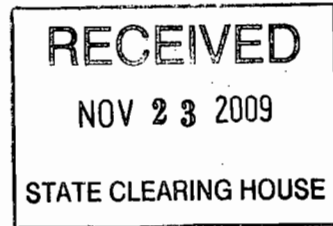

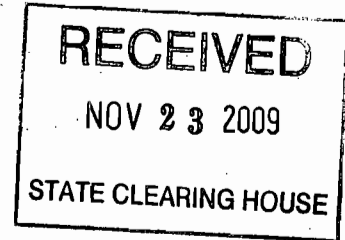
