I had a conversation with Mr. Skumawitz about the current situation with children crossing SR-74 to get to Romoland Elementary School which is one block north of the highway. There are no traffic signals along this part of the highway that provide easy access to the school for children who live south of SR-74. There is a flashing yellow light and a warning sign that says "school crossing." There is also a crossing guard that assists children but it is still a somewhat dangerous situation since vehicles on this section of the highway are traveling around 65 mph. My concern is that additional traffic related to the construction of the proposed Sun Valley power plant could use this section of the highway to access the project site.

We discussed some options both short and long term. Short term mitigation would be to have workers use an alternate rout that would not involve this section of SR-74. Long term options include a street light at the intersection of a north-south oriented (Sherman Road) road and SR-74, or move the school to another site. I told Mr. Skumawitz that this issue would be addressed in the traffic and transportation analysis in the PSA, discussed at a PSA workship, and revisited in the FSA. He would appreciate any help in finding a solution to the existing situation.
