

# NOTICE OF RECEIPT SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION FOR THE WALNUT CREEK ENERGY PARK APPLICATION FOR CERTIFICATION (05-AFC-2)



On November 22, 2005, Walnut Creek Energy, LLC (WCE), a wholly-owned subsidiary of Edison Mission Energy (EME), submitted an Application for Certification (AFC) to the California Energy Commission seeking approval to construct and operate a simple-cycle (peaking) power plant, the Walnut Creek Energy Park (WCEP), in the City of Industry, Los Angeles County. On January 13, 2006, WCE provided a supplement to the AFC to satisfy the Energy Commission's informational requirements. On February 1, 2006, the Energy Commission accepted the AFC with the supplemental information as complete. The staff of the Energy Commission has now begun the data discovery and analysis phases of the project's 12-month licensing process.

## **Project Description**

The proposed WCEP would be a 500 megawatt (MW) natural gas-fired peaking power plant to be located at 911 Bixby Drive in the City of Industry. The WCEP is designed as a peaking facility to meet electric generation load during periods of high demand. The proposed project would use recycled water for cooling and other power plant processes and would connect to the Southern California Edison (SCE) electrical transmission grid via a new 600-foot-long, 230-kilovolt transmission line to the SCE Walnut Substation, which is located approximately 250 feet south of the project site.

#### **Energy Commission's Facility Certification Process**

The Energy Commission is responsible for reviewing and ultimately approving or denying all thermal electric power plants, 50 MW and greater, proposed for construction in California. The Energy Commission's facility certification process carefully examines public health and safety, environmental impacts, and engineering aspects of proposed power plants, and all related facilities such as electric transmission lines and natural gas pipelines. The Energy Commission's responsibilities are similar to those of a lead agency under the California Environmental Quality Act.

### **Public Participation**

Over the coming months, the Energy Commission will conduct a number of public workshops and hearings on the proposal to determine whether the project should be approved for construction and operation and, if so, under what set of conditions. These workshops will provide the public as well as local, state and federal agencies the opportunity to ask questions about, and provide input on, the proposed project. An Informational Hearing and Site Visit will be held in the City of Industry on February 28, 2006, with details on the time and location to be provided by the Commission in a

separate mailing. The Energy Commission will issue notices for all workshops and hearings at least 10-14 days prior to the meeting.
