PROPOSED NEW POWER PLANT IN RIVERSIDE COUNTY

Dear Tribal Historic Preservation Officer Begay:

Your name was provided to the California Energy Commission (Energy Commission) by the Native American Heritage Commission as a representative of a Native American community who might be interested in the proposed construction and operation of a power plant in the Riverside County.

The Energy Commission has jurisdiction over the proposed project and has received an application for a permit to build and operate the power plant, known as the CPV Sentinel Energy Project, of approximately 800 megawatts, in Riverside County near the City of Palm Springs. Portions of the gas line route will be located in the City of Palm Springs. You will receive, if you have not already received, specific information about the proposed power plant from the project applicant. We will also be holding workshops and hearings over the coming months on the project and our assessment. You will be notified concerning the times, locations and the topics to be covered.
