

PROPOSED NEW POWER PLANT IN EASTERN SAN BERNARDING COUNTY

The California Energy Commission has received an application for a permit to build a new solar power plant, in eastern San Bernardino County. The project site in located in:

T16N R14E, Sections 2, 3, 4, 10, and 11, and T17N R14E, Sections 20, 21, 27, 28, 29, 33, and 34.

Please see accompanying map, which encompasses parts of the Clark Mountain and Ivanpah Lake USGS quadrangle maps.

A portion of the Energy Commission's permitting process involves notifying citizens and addressing their concerns. We anticipate holding public workshops and hearings in the future, and we would like to notify representatives of the Native American community concerning the time and place of these public workshops.
