John Carrier writes in response to Ellie's Questions regarding totals listed for Waste Management in the AFC for the Highgrove Project::

In going back and reviewing those numbers, there are two subsections that have errors. They are attached. The correct numbers are shown in **bold underlined** text.

8.13.4.2.1 Nonhazardous Solid Waste

The majority of solid waste will include rags, turbine air filters, broken and rusted metal and machine parts, defective or broken electrical materials, empty containers, the typical refuse generated by workers and small office operations, and other miscellaneous solid wastes. The quantity generated is estimated to be about 30 cubic yards per year (approximately ~~21~~ **45** tons per year). Large metal parts will be recycled.

8.13.7 Cumulative Impacts

The Highgrove Project facility will generate nonhazardous solid waste that will add to the total waste generated in San Bernardino County and in California. However, there is adequate recycling and landfill capacity in California to recycle and dispose of the waste generated by the Highgrove Project. It is estimated that the plant will generate approximately ~~534~~ **93** tons of solid waste during construction, ~~569~~ **6,500** tons during demolition and about ~~8,400~~ **106.5** tons a year from operations (including approximately ~~2~~ **one** tons of hazardous waste). Compared to the total amount of solid waste landfilled in San Bernardino County in the year 2004 of 1,791,864 tons, the Highgrove Project's contribution will represent less than 1 percent of total county waste disposal (CIWMB, 2006b). Therefore, the impact of the project on solid waste recycling and disposal capacity is not significant.
