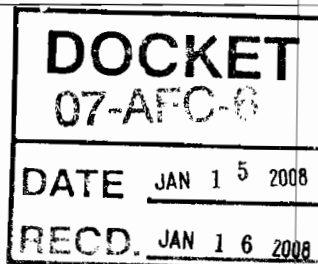

Re docket 07-AFC-6 proposed Carlsbad Energy Center:

What strength earthquake is the Center being designed to withstand? What strength earthquake is the existing power plant and smokestack designed to withstand? What CEC rules govern such design decisions?

Apart from the Carlsbad Energy Center, is the CEC asking the Applicant in conjunction with this application to consider renewable energy projects on its Encina property or offsite in keeping with the CEC goal to shift to renewable sources? Such projects could be another incremental means to achieve the goal of phasing out the old plant.

Who holds title/control over the tidelands and submerged lands in the adjacent lagoon? Will this status change if NRG no longer uses the cooling water intake? Does the public trust doctrine pertain to these lands?

Do any offsite channels or runoff drain into the power plant property?

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
