NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY OF THE STAFF ASSESSMENT / DRAFT PLAN AMENDMENT / DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT FOR THE RIDGECREST SOLAR POWER PROJECT, APPLICATION FOR CERTIFICATION (09-AFC-9)

This notice is to inform you that the U.S. Bureau of Land Management (BLM) and the California Energy Commission (CEC) have prepared a joint environmental review document deemed a "Staff Assessment/Draft Plan Amendment/Draft Environmental Impact Statement (SA/DPA/DEIS)". Additionally, this notice is to inform you of the availability of the SA/DPA/DEIS which was published by the CEC on March 26, 2010. The SA/DPA/DEIS contains the BLM's and the CEC's engineering, public health, and environmental evaluation of the proposed RSPP.

The SA/DPA/DEIS will serve as CEC staff's testimony during evidentiary hearings held by the Commission. The Energy Commission Committee assigned to the RSPP proceedings will consider and weigh the testimony and or comments and or recommendations of all interested parties, including Energy Commission staff, the applicant, intervenors, public, and other local, state, and federal agencies, before issuing the Presiding Member's Proposed Decision (PMPD) for consideration by the full Energy Commission. The public, intervenors, local, state and federal agencies are encouraged to participate in these hearings. The Energy Commission will issue notices at least ten days prior to any scheduled hearings.

The California Energy Commission encourages public and agency participation in the review of staff's SA/DPA/DEIS. For purposes of the CEC's evidentiary hearings, written comments on the SA/DPA/DEIS should be provided to Eric Solorio, Siting Project Manager, no later than 5:00 p.m., April 30, 2010 at the address on this letterhead (please add "Mail Slot 15") or by email to esolorio@energy.state.ca.us. The BLM plans to issue its Notice of Availability in the Federal Register on April 9, 2010 which will begin the BLM's 90-day public comment period on the SA/DPA/DEIS, under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) in conjunction with the BLM's review of the RSPP.

SUMMARY OF THE PROPOSED RIDGECREST SOLAR POWER PROJECT

On September 1, 2009, Solar Millennium LLC submitted an Application for Certification (AFC) to the California Energy Commission (CEC) to develop the Ridgecrest Solar Power Project (RSPP) on federal land administered by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) in Kern County, California. Solar Millennium also submitted an

application to the BLM for a right-of way grant on public land, together with a Plan of Development.

Solar Millennium LLC is proposing to construct a utility-scale solar thermal electric power generating facility. The RSPP will have a nominal output of 250 megawatts (MW), consisting of a single power plant utilizing two solar fields. The RSPP will utilize parabolic trough technology to generate electricity. With this technology, arrays of parabolic mirrors collect heat energy from the sun and refocus the radiation on a receiver tube located at the focal point of the parabola. A heat transfer fluid (HTF) reaches high temperatures (750 degrees Fahrenheit [°F]) as it circulates through the receiver tubes. The HTF is then piped through a series of heat exchangers where it releases its stored energy to generate high pressure steam. The steam is then fed to a traditional steam turbine generator where electricity is produced.

The project is proposed to be developed on an approximately 2,000-acre site, administered by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM). The project site is located in north-eastern Kern County, along U.S Highway 395, just west of the China Lake Boulevard exit. The site is approximately five miles southwest of Ridgecrest, California. Ridgecrest is at the southwestern boundary of the China Lake Naval Air Weapons Station (NAWS).

ENERGY COMMISSION'S AND THE BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT'S JOINT ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW PROCESS

The BLM and the CEC have prepared a joint environmental review document (SA/DPA/DEIS) because it is in the interest of the BLM and the CEC to share in the preparation of a joint environmental analysis of the proposed project to avoid duplication of staff efforts, to share staff expertise and information, to promote intergovernmental coordination at the local, state, and federal levels, and to facilitate public review by providing a joint document and a more efficient environmental review process.

Under federal law, the BLM is responsible for processing requests for rights-of-way to authorize the proposed project and associated transmission lines and other facilities to be constructed and operated on land it manages. In processing applications, the BLM must comply with the requirements of NEPA, which requires that federal agencies reviewing projects under their jurisdiction consider the environmental impacts associated with the proposed project construction and operation. In order to comply with NEPA the BLM cooperated with the Energy Commission to prepare a Draft Environmental Impact Statement and Draft Plan Amendment that was combined with the Energy Commission's Staff Assessment in a joint document.

As the lead state agency under CEQA, the Energy Commission is responsible for reviewing and ultimately approving or denying all applications to construct and operate thermal electric power plants, 50 MW and greater, in California. The CEC's site certification process carefully examines public health and safety, environmental impacts and engineering aspects of proposed power plants and all related facilities such as electric transmission lines, and natural gas and water pipelines.

PUBLIC AND AGENCY PARTICIPATION

The BLM and the CEC have jointly conducted three public workshops and two formal scoping meetings. The BLM and the CEC will conduct at least two more public workshops to discuss the contents of the SA/DPA/DEIS and continue to work through any outstanding issues. These workshops will provide the public as well as local, state and federal agencies the opportunity to ask questions about, and provide input on, the proposed project. All public notices will be made in accordance with the Energy Commission's notice requirements, and the BLM's notice requirements set forth by NEPA and BLM's environmental review policies.
