Hi Cindy:

Usually the numbering of exhibits is decided by the party submitting them. For instance, if the Applicant wants to, they can submit the whole AFC as "Exhibit 1" or they can divide it up by section, i.e. Project Description = Exhibit 1, Biology = Exhibit 2, etc.

I believe that you are better off dividing up the exhibits so that you are able to relate them to a subject area as required in the Prehearing Order attached to the Notice. This should be a common sense determination, but I would separate a document from its appendices, just so it's easier to talk about each separate document on the record.

As to how and whether to file any particular exhibit, I would refer you to the Public Advisor because I don't want to be perceived as improperly giving any party legal advice. That's what the Public Advisor is there to do.
