

August 20, 1849.

Moving of Emigrants at Stand at 8 am when instruction from Jefferson Hunt
Hunt called for Mr. Watters & Mr. Goodale & Mr. Kinney - mountaineers - (not miners) to come & contradict his statement
Gentl. I am now going to give a detail, once for all. I have many miraculous reports but no nothing of humor
I went by the S. route to the Pacific. 19 men & boys & 30 animals & were 46 days going - staid a few weeks - got 900 cows &
160 animals & we returned nearly same route - I left here 19 Nov. - & went to Cali. The snow was here a few days - arrived
at Williamson's rancheros latter end of Dec. - staid 3 weeks - & came back here about 1st May - there is no trouble from here to Sierra River
I have no intention to say there will be plenty of grass & water - the difficult parts are little hills - the way is tolerable rough
from little Salt Lake to a creek abt. 2 miles - a Shining about 1/2 way among Cedars

Collected: Bitter Spring	50	one level basin about 6 miles rocky - little grass
Malibony River	40	no grass - same sage - sandy basin 10 miles - see Col mountains

The season is mild except summer - is hot - about 1500 animals - 3000 sheep & 400 cows in one caravan -
I will release men to go & show you that country in 1000 a wagon - you wish the way not me - I'll find it -
we ought not to start before 1st Oct: - go down in 60 or 70 days -
825 miles to Los Angeles

My dear you & strangers to me - I represent this trip - Major Hunt. I have been acquainted with many years. he has offered his
services to go South route - we are far from mounted - we shall be flooded with men - we wish all who come, to proceed on
their journey - if we are a couple of provisions we do advise you to stay all winter - we are offered \$50 a day for horses
if we don't pay we are nothing for ourselves & neighbors. it won't be hard - all who are started for Gold regions - are braves
of deliverance - they tell them need it - & anxious to get where it is - We recommend any man to go the northern road
it won't be bordering on taking their lives - & it won't be dangerous to go the north route - we are detained our own
going that route - we are not much confidence in going that route this fall - but there is plenty in Spring - I don't care no
hesitation in going the S. road perfectly safe all the time - Major Hunt has not measured the road - I only chart is his
recollection - I beg to give you a little council - what to do - if mine does not prevail we
can not prosper - let me council you to mount, & travel as fast as mine - if you don't you are in imminent danger -
Now as we are all due back to Lodi men have gone there - form into Co's as a picket to each Co. - with a horse -
search round, & cut up camp grounds - let there be a united effort - you can go easily - there is no necessity of carrying
broken down cattle - there is no necessity of avis any wagon or animal injured - if there hunting in a Co. - & had
any difficulty I don't leave their wagon till it was thru - if you are 4 Co's draw out 10 extra men as Pioneer
then go thru with light teams - & work the Kanyons, when main train comes on there is no hindrance - your cattle will
be as good as when they leave this place - bearing to the advice of a stranger - patience & perseverance will go far -
When we were here 2 yrs ago - we never lost one or - laid off a city - & etc. with same teams same year -
Major Hunt prefers his service to go - there are some young men will go with him - I want to see him to W. for it - he is
a poor honest & honest man - he is not here avying nothing for himself or family - I wo't be willing to give him - what he asks
W.W. with all my heart - wished of your leaving off your own cattle - but them in good fit - recruit them - & then go on -
if you go in Union - you will act out magnanimous -
