SUBJECT: Determination regarding requirement for Department of the Army Permit

Dear Ms. Farmer:

I am responding to your request (File No. SPL-2012-00370-CMS) dated August 16, 2011, for clarification on whether a Department of the Army Permit is required for the Quail Brush project located north of San Clemente Canyon Freeway (SR-52), east of Medina Drive, and adjacent to Sycamore Landfill Road in the city of San Diego, San Diego County, California (Latitude 32.8613, Longitude -117.0346).

The Corps' evaluation process for determining whether or not a Department of the Army permit is needed involves two tests. The first test determines whether or not the proposed project is located within or contains a water of the United States (i.e., it is within the Corps' geographic jurisdiction). The second test determines whether or not the proposed project includes an activity potentially regulated under Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act or Section 404 of the Clean Water Act. If both tests are met, <u>and</u> the activities in question are located within the Corps' geographic jurisdiction, then a permit would be required. As part of our evaluation process, we have made the determination below.

#### *Geographic jurisdiction:*

Based on the information you have provided, dated August 16, 2011, we have determined the Quail Brush project site may contain water(s) of the United States pursuant to 33 C.F.R. §325.9. Please note, until a jurisdictional determination is approved by the Corps for the project area, we cannot rule out that waters of the United States occur on-site.

#### Activity:

Based on the information you have provided, we have determined the proposed work, were it to occur in waters of the United States (see above, "Geographic jurisdiction"), would not involve a discharge of dredged or fill material and therefore, would not be regulated under

Section 404 of the Clean Water Act if the activity is performed in the manner described in your application.

Requirement for a Department of the Army Permit:

Based on the discussion above, we have determined your proposed project is not subject to our jurisdiction under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act and a Department of the Army permit would not be required from our office if the activity is performed in the manner described. As previously stated, please note, until a jurisdictional determination is approved by the Corps for the project area, we cannot rule out that waters of the United States occur onsite. Notwithstanding our determination above, your proposed project may be regulated under other Federal, State, and local laws.

#### Hey Richard,

Attached is the original jurisdictional delineation as well as an update map including the old project area as well as the new project site. All of the proposed alternatives will cross one drainage feature that is designated as a blue-line drainage on the USGS topographic map and located in the southeastern corner of the attached map. This drainage is mostly contained within an upland swale with periodic eroded areas that appear to be intermittent ordinary high water marks. The drainage feature will be crossed by a transmission line, but will not likely be impacted by any project related impacts. There is an existing transmission line that already crosses the drainage and the new transmission line will parrallel the existing line utilizing the exisiting access roads. Please let me know if you need any information that you required to prepare a letter of concurrence stating that no waters of the US. will be impacted by project construction.
