PETITION TO INTERVENE BY COUNTY OF SAN BERNARDINO

Pursuant to sections 1207 and 1712 of Title 20 of the California Code of Regulations, the County of San Bernardino ("County") petitions to intervene in this proceeding.

Section 1207(a) grants "any person" the right to file a petition to intervene which sets forth "the grounds for the intervention, the position and interest of the petitioner in the proceeding, the extent to which the petitioner desires to participate in the proceedings, and the name, address, and telephone number of the petitioner." Section 1207(c) provides that the "presiding member may grant leave to intervene to any petitioner to the extent he deems reasonable and relevant"

The County is a large and mostly rural county, with vast open spaces and sweeping vistas. The unique considerations of the County's location between Los Angeles and Las Vegas, with their intensive energy consumption, combined with climatic conditions and high proportion of federal lands, which comprise approximately 80 percent of the County, have attracted applications for numerous large-scale

renewable energy power plants. A plurality or majority of the dozens of proposed renewable energy projects are seeking land and rights of way in San Bernardino County.

The County's economic conditions are challenging. The population is scattered, with a few urban centers in the desert regions. Power transmission and transportation infrastructure are limited to a few corridors. The Calico Solar Power Project (Calico) proposes the construction, maintenance, and operation of an 850 megawatt (MW) solar electric generating facility on 8,230 acres of land administered by the Bureau of Land Management in an unincorporated area of San Bernardino County. This project directly affects the County's immediate economic interests. The County asks that the Commission perform an adequate review of the impacts to the local economic conditions, including the generation of property taxes, jobs, housing needs, and the provision and cost of emergency services to the proposed power plant. CEC Staff is recommending that in order to mitigate the project's impacts upon biological resources, the project applicant be required to acquire 14,018 acres of mitigation land. These types of mitigation requirements are of great concern to the County since the project takes huge amounts of acreage out of a use that will generate tax revenues to offset County resources upon which the project relies. This loss of acreage represents a significant economic loss to the County which fully supports a fee in lieu program that looks to other mitigation measures beyond blanket habitat acquisitions.

The County's unique geologic conditions also present challenges. A cumulative impact to groundwater is an issue of increasing concern to the County and compliance with the County's groundwater ordinance is a minimum.

The County has an interest in the economic and environmental impacts of the Calico Project. The County supports the concept of renewable energy, when it is

managed in an environmentally responsible and economically beneficial way but is concerned about projects that cause serious environmental hardship without providing countervailing economic benefits. The Commission's application process provides for a balancing of the Project's socio-economic and environmental impacts. The County's ultimate position in this proceeding will be determined based on all of the factors that will be considered by the Commission.

The County wishes to participate fully in all phases of this proceeding. Filings should be served on the County at the address listed below.

For the foregoing reasons, the County respectfully requests that the Commission grant its petition to intervene in this proceeding, and allow the County to participate as a party.
