I am writing to protest the proposed location of the Imperial Valley Solar Project site near Coyote Wells and Plaster City, California. I believe it would cause irreparable damage to the interpretation and appreciation of California's unique history, specifically to the Juan Bautista de Anza National Historic Trail.

This is against the law of the National Trails System Act (P.L. 90-543 and PL 101-365) which recognizes the contributions and importance of this trail.

I am a 7th generation Californian, a descendant of one of the colonists of this historic Anza Expedition on this trail and great great granddaughter of General Mariano Guadalupe Vallejo, who held the last Supreme Military Command of California, Commandant General of the Army in California, Commander in Chief of Mexico.

I am a member of Los Californianos, California Mission Studies, one of the first women accepted into the regular membership of the Society of California Pioneers and in the process of being one of the first women of Spanish descents accepted into the DAR.

I am a teacher of California State docents and 4th grade students. I am a published California Historian and producer of programs on California history.

I want my protest to be officially recognized in the Docket 08-AFC-5.
