

Notice of Availability of the

Final Staff Assessment for the Proposed

GWF Tracy Combined Cycle Power Plant (08-AFC-7)

TO: AGENCY DISTRIBUTION LIST

This notice is to inform you of the availability of the Final Staff Assessment (FSA) for the proposed GWF Tracy Combined Cycle Power Plant (GWF Tracy) Application for Certification (08-AFC-7). The FSA was published on October 30, 2009. The FSA contains the California Energy Commission staff's final engineering, public health, and environmental evaluation of the proposed plant.

The FSA will serve as staff's testimony during evidentiary hearings. The Energy Commission Committee assigned to the GWF Tracy proceedings will consider and weigh the testimony or comments or recommendations of all interested parties, including Energy Commission staff, the applicant, intervenors, public, and other local, state, and federal agencies, before issuing the Presiding Member's Proposed Decision (PMPD) for consideration by the full Energy Commission. The public, intervenors, local, state and federal agencies are encouraged to participate in these hearings. The Energy Commission will issue notices at least ten days prior to any scheduled hearings.

Energy Commission Licensing Authority

The Energy Commission is responsible for reviewing and ultimately approving or denying all applications for construction and operation of thermal electric power plants, 50 MW and greater, proposed for construction in California. The Energy Commission's facility certification process carefully examines public health and safety, environmental impacts and engineering aspects of proposed power plants, and all related facilities such as electric transmission lines and natural gas and water pipelines. The Energy Commission is the lead agency under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), and because the regulatory program has been certified by the Natural Resources Agency pursuant to Public Resources Code section 21080.5, produces several environmental and decision documents rather than an Environmental Impact Report.

Summary of the California Energy Commission Staff's Conclusions

The California Energy Commission staff concludes that the proposed GWF Tracy Combined Cycle Power Plant in San Joaquin County can be permitted and constructed in a manner that would allow it to comply with environmental laws and state policies –

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with the adoption of staff's recommended mitigation measures.
