Alan,

This email pertains to the AFC Supplement for Watson Cogeneration Steam and Electric Reliability Project (09-AFC-01).

Per the conversation today between Joe Diamond of the CEC and Katie Carroz of Carroz Consulting LLC (on behalf of URS Corporation), here is the Socioeconomic information that was discussed and requested:

Indirect economic benefits of construction would include an estimated 109 jobs (see Section 5.10.2.2 of the AFC). These jobs would be temporary and would last as long as the 26-month site preparation and construction period. In-migration in order to fill these jobs is expected to be negligible due to the large available workforce in the project area and the temporary nature of these jobs. Assuming as a worst-case scenario that five percent of these jobs are filled by in-migrating workers who remain in the area after construction has ended, 17 people (5.5 households) would be new to the area.

The response that is in the AFC Supplement describes the estimation of the rest of the population increase (total population increase of 26).
