

Re: Oakley Generating Station

Dear Ms. Jones,



I am the president of Cline Cellars, Inc. We are pleased that Radback Energy has kept Cline Cellars informed with regards to their plan to permit and construct the Oakley Generating Station (OGS) that will be located on the DuPont property in the City of Oakley. Our company understands that the OGS project is currently undergoing environmental review with your agency, the California Energy Commission. Accordingly, I write this letter to convey our company's support of the OGS project.

As a result of our discussions with Radback, it is our understanding the project, as proposed, will remove approximately thirteen acres of grapes on the DuPont property that is currently farmed by Cline. Cline has managed these grapes for twenty five years with the understanding that they could someday be removed from production. These grapes have a very low yield and the removal of these vineyards will have little impact on the production of Cline Cellars product. In our opinion, due to its size, the low yields and proximity to industrial development, we do not consider this property to have great agricultural potential and it should not be treated as prime farmland. To that end, Cline Cellars has no objection to the removal of these vineyards from the DuPont property.

Cline Cellars remains very supportive of the Oakley Generating Station and appreciates the opportunity to offer these comments to the California Energy Commission.
