Thank you for the opportunity to review and comment on **Preliminary Staff Assessment Part A for the Proposed Huntington Beach Energy Project (12-AFC-02)**. The PSA Part A contains the California Energy Commission staff's preliminary engineering, environmental and public health and safety evaluation of the proposed HBEP. The project is located in the city of Huntington Beach just north of the intersection of Pacific Coast Highway (SR-1) and Newland Street.

**The Department of Transportation (Department) is a commenting agency on this project and has the following comments for your consideration:**

1. Please coordinate with Department to meet requirements for any work within or near State right-of-way. All entities other than the Department working within the Department's right-of-way must obtain an Encroachment Permit prior to commencement of work. Please allow 2 to 4 weeks for a complete submittal to be reviewed and for a permit to be issued.
2. A Traffic Management Plan (TMP) for construction vehicles should be submitted to Caltrans in order to minimize the impacts to State highway facilities, particularly SR-1 Pacific Coast Highway. Coordination of this project with other construction activities on SR-1 may be needed. Any hauling of materials should not occur during A.M. and P.M. peak periods of travel on State facilities during demolition and construction of the proposed project. All

vehicle loads should be covered so that materials do not blow over or onto the Department's right-of-way.


