Purpose of Evidentiary Hearing on an SPPE Application

....

The SPPE process, which incorporates requirements equivalent to the Initial Study process under the California Environmental Quality Act, will examine whether the proposed project will create a substantial adverse impact upon the environment or energy resources. The review process provides a public forum allowing the Applicant, Energy Commission staff, governmental agencies, adjacent landowners, and members of the general public to consider whether the proposed project qualifies for an exemption from the Commission's licensing process.

At the evidentiary hearing, the Applicant shall have the burden of proving that the Santa Clara SC-1 Data Center, Phase 2 will have no substantial adverse impact upon the environment or energy resources to qualify for an exemption from the California Energy Commission's certification process. (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 20, § 1212.)

Local, state, and federal governmental agencies may participate at the Evidentiary Hearing, as necessary. Elected officials and members of the public may present public

comments at these events and/or submit written comments to the Energy Commission's Docket Unit, <u>NO LATER than 5:00 p.m.,</u> <u>Wednesday, February 22, 2012</u>. (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 20, § 1940.) Please include "Santa Clara Sc-1 Data Center, Docket No. 11-SPPE-01" on any written comments.

ORDER RE: SUBMISSION OF PREHEARING STATEMENTS

To facilitate the process, each party shall serve and file a **Prehearing Statement**. Each party's Prehearing Statement shall be provided to and received by the other parties and the Commission's Docket Unit, **NO LATER than 3:00 p.m.**, **Monday, February 13, 2012**. The parties shall e-mail their statements to the Hearing Adviser as well as to the Docket Unit and the parties as indicated on the Proof-of-Service list. The parties shall also submit a **MICROSOFT WORD version** of their statements to the Hearing Adviser via e-mail.

FAILURE TO FILE A TIMELY PREHEARING STATEMENT MAY PRECLUDE A PARTY FROM SUBMITTING EVIDENCE AT THIS HEARING.

Each statement shall set forth the following under a separate heading:

- a) The topic areas that remain disputed and require adjudication, and the precise nature of the dispute for each topic;
- b) The identity of each witness sponsored by the party (note: witnesses must have professional expertise in the discipline of their testimony); the topic area(s) which each witness will present; a brief summary of the testimony to be offered by each witness; qualifications of each witness; the time required to present direct testimony by each witness; and whether the party seeks to have the witness testify in person or telephonically;
- c) Topic areas upon which a party desires to cross-examine witnesses, a summary of the scope of each such cross-examination (including voir dire of any witness' qualifications), and the time desired for each such cross-examination;
- d) A list identifying exhibits, including declarations, that each party intends to offer into evidence and the technical topics to which they apply; and
- e) For all topics, any proposed modifications to the proposed Conditions of Certification listed in the Staff's Initial Study based upon enforceability, ease of comprehension, and consistency with the evidence.

Format for Presenting Evidence

The parties shall provide written testimonial and documentary evidence as follows:

1. Each document shall be numbered and identified on an **Exhibit List**. (Use example attached to this Notice.)

- Applicant's exhibits shall be numbered consecutively as Exhibits 1 through 199.
- Staff's exhibits shall be numbered consecutively as Exhibits 200 through 299.

Copies of the Exhibits shall be provided to the Committee and other parties <u>NO LATER than 3:00 p.m.</u>, on Monday, February 13, 2012. Failure to timely exchange exhibits may result in exclusion of evidence.

FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THE FILING REQUIREMENTS STATED IN THIS ORDER MAY PRECLUDE A PARTY FROM SUBMITTING EVIDENCE AT THIS HEARING.

Petitions to Intervene to Become a Formal Party

Only formal parties (Applicant, Staff, or Intervenors) may present evidence and cross-examine witnesses at the evidentiary hearing. The Presiding Member's Proposed Decision (PMPD) on the Santa Clara Sc-1 Data Center project will be based solely upon the official evidentiary record developed at the evidentiary hearing.

Anyone with an appropriate interest in the Santa Clara Sc-1 Data Center Project may file a Petition to Intervene and become a formal party. At the evidentiary hearing, the formal parties may offer testimony and documentary evidence, receive documents filed by other parties, and cross-examine witnesses. However, a formal party must also comply with all Committee orders, procedures, and filing requirements, and is subject to discovery and having its own witnesses cross-examined by other parties.

To facilitate the participation of all parties and allow for an orderly and efficient evidentiary hearing, the DEADLINE TO FILE a Petition to Intervene in this case is 3:00 p.m., Monday, February 13, 2012. (20 Cal. Code Regs., § 1203(f).) Intervenors take the proceedings as they find them at the time their petition is granted. Time extensions will not be granted for new Intervenors to review case materials.

Public Adviser and Public Participation

The Energy Commission invites members of the public and other interested parties to participate either on an informal basis or by intervening in the proceeding. Both types of participation allow written and oral comments. At the informal participation level, written and oral public comments are considered by the commissioners and are part of the record, but are not part of the formal evidentiary record. Intervenors have the right to introduce evidence into the evidentiary record and cross-examine the other parties' witnesses.

The Energy Commission's Public Adviser's Office is available to provide the public with an understanding of a proceeding and to make recommendations for meaningful participation. INSTRUCTIONS FOR USING WEBEX TELECONFERENCING USING YOUR COMPUTER AND/OR TELEPHONE



STEP 1: Go to https://energy.webex.com

STEP 2: Enter the Meeting Number: 929 563 938

STEP 3: Enter the Meeting Password (case sensitive): SPPEsc-1

STEP 4: After you log-in, a prompt will appear on-screen asking for your phone number. In the Number box, type your area code and phone number, and then click "OK." 
