**NOTICE OF RECEIPT****PETITION TO AMEND
THE CALIFORNIA ENERGY COMMISSION DECISION FOR THE
CAMPBELL COGENERATION PROJECT (93-AFC-3C)**

On November 2, 2018, the Sacramento Power Authority (SPA) filed a petition with the California Energy Commission requesting to modify the SPA Campbell Cogeneration Project (SPAC). The 158-megawatt (MW) cogeneration project was certified by the Energy Commission on November 30, 1994, and began commercial operation in 1997. The facility is located at 3215 47th Avenue, east of the corner of 47th Avenue and Franklin Boulevard, approximately 1 mile west of Highway 99 in an unincorporated area of Sacramento County. The project is on approximately 5.8 acres adjacent to the former Campbell Soup facility.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED MODIFICATION

In the petition filed, SPA is proposing the following actions:

- Install a Siemens wet compression system upgrade in order to reclaim electrical production typically lost during high ambient temperature conditions;
- Replace the two existing burners with upgraded Siemens HR3 burners; and
- Increase the start-up carbon monoxide (CO) emission limit to reflect the revelation, by a recent emission monitoring system upgrade, that startup CO emissions have the potential to exceed current limits.

The SPAC modifications will not increase either:

- Electrical generation in excess of the 158 MW currently licensed for the facility, or
- Fuel consumption beyond existing licensed limits.

ENERGY COMMISSION AMENDMENT REVIEW PROCEDURES

Energy Commission staff is currently reviewing the petition. The purpose of the Energy Commission's review process is to assess the impacts of this proposal on environmental quality and on public health and safety. The review process includes an

evaluation of the consistency of the proposed changes with the Energy Commission's Decision and a determination on whether the facility, as modified, would remain in compliance with applicable laws, ordinances, regulations and standards (20 Cal. Code of Regs., § 1769). After the staff has completed its independent review and analysis of this petition to amend, it will publish its assessment for public review and comment.

This Notice of Receipt is being mailed to the Commission's facility mail list of interested parties and property owners adjacent to the facility site. It is also being *emailed to the Campbell listserv*. The listserv is an automated Energy Commission system by which information about this facility is emailed to parties who have subscribed.
