California Energy Commission staff will host a webinar to present the comments received from interested parties as a result of staff's request for public comment. Background

The Energy Commission is in the early stages of developing an energy savings roadmap for consumer electronics and appliances in their standby, idle, or in general LPM. To do so, the Energy Commission is considering collecting data to characterize LPM power draw for a wide variety of products using a common data collection procedure.

On June 20, 2018, the Energy Commission published a discussion document that contained preliminary instructions for product testing setup, along with a list of information needed to develop a test procedure allowing subsequent collection of data on the performance and energy use of products while in LPM.

During this webinar, staff will present a general overview of the LPM roadmap and the comments received as a result of staff's request for public comment on the "Low Power Mode Test Procedure Discussion Document."
