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multiple landowners operate shared pumping facilities, pursuing solar collectively

The farm where our group is wanting to pursue a solar development is comprised of several landowners operating their farms separately on a shared water conveyance system which includes a series of electric lift pumps and deep wells located throughout the 1,200 acre rice farming ranch. The ranch was originally owned and farmed by my grandfather and his brothers together under their farming company. Now that the land has been passed down to the next generation, various landowners have decided to farm their portions of the ranch on their own. However, because the water conveyance system was designed as if the ranch was all being operated as one, landowners decided it would be in everyone's best interest to form an agreement, tied to the land, that would ensure equal share of the water and conveyance facilities amongst the landowners based on acreage. Several years ago we created a recorded legal agreement in place which ties all of the water conveyance facilities and required access to the land, in perpetuity, so water system operation and access will not be interrupted by the sale of any lands within the ranch. Ideally, the group of landowners would want to pursue ownership of a single solar development collectively in order to reduce the use of electricity. The cost incurred by each landowner would be based on the proportion of acreage they own. All of this background information leads me to my question regarding how the group should go about applying to the REAP program. Could a project like this be handled under one application even though it would involve multiple farming operations? Would each landowner submit their own individual application as a part of the overall solar development? Would it be best for the owner of the land where the solar is to be located apply as an individual and then arrange for reimbursement from the other landowners at a later time? Are there any other implications associated with the structure outlined above that would need to be considered during the application submission process?
