**NOTICE OF STAFF APPROVAL**  
**PETITION FOR CHANGE OF OPERATIONAL CONTROL**  
**for the**  
**CALPEAK BORDER PROJECT (01-EP-14C)**

On February 8, 2019, CalPeak Power – Border, LLC, filed a petition with the California Energy Commission (Energy Commission) requesting to change operational control of the CalPeak Power – Border project (CPB) to NAES Corporation. The 49.5-megawatt, simple-cycle, natural gas-fired peaking plant was certified by the Energy Commission on July 11, 2001 with an on-line date of November 7, 2001. Energy Commission action was taken pursuant to Executive Orders D-26-01 and D-28-01 to help avoid or reduce blackouts and other adverse consequences of the energy supply emergency in the state. The facility is located in the city of San Diego.

The petition is requesting to change operational control of the facility to NAES Corporation. A statement describing the change in operational control, signed under penalty of perjury by a representative of NAES Corporation, was submitted as required by Title 20, California Code of Regulations, section 1769(b). The statement affirms that NAES Corporation understands the conditions of certification and agrees to comply with those conditions.

Staff has reviewed the petition and has determined that the petition meets the requirements of Title 20, California Code of Regulations, section 1769(b). Accordingly, Staff hereby approves the petition to change operational control. Any person may file an objection to staff's approval within 14 days of the filing of this notice. Any such objection must state the grounds for the objection. If a person files such an objection, the petition will be considered by the Energy Commission at a noticed business meeting or hearing.

An objection to staff's approval may be submitted using the Energy Commission's e-Commenting feature. Go to the Energy Commission's webpage for this facility, cited above, click on the "Submit e-Comment" link, and follow the instructions in the on-line form. Be sure to include the facility name in your comments. Once submitted, the Energy Commission Dockets Unit reviews and approves your comments, and you will receive an e-mail with a link to them.

The petition requesting the change of operational control has been docketed and is available on the Energy Commission's webpage for this facility at <https://www.energy.ca.gov/sitingcases/peakers/border/index.html>.
