# Climate Change Adaptation Order Instituting Rulemaking

**Proceeding number: R.18-04-019**

**Objective: Provide guidance to investor-owned electric and gas utilities on how to incorporate climate adaptation into their planning and operations**





# Phase 1 Working Group Topics

## Phase 1

1. **Definition:** Definition of climate adaptation for utilities (*Liz Whiteman, Ocean Science Trust*)
2. **Data:** Appropriate data sources, models, and tools for climate adaptation decision-making (*Juliette Hart, USGS*)
3. **Planning Guidelines:** Guidelines for utility climate adaptation assessment and planning (*Matthew Tisdale, Gridworks*)
4. **Disadvantaged and Vulnerable Communities:** Identification and prioritization of actions to address the climate change related needs of vulnerable and disadvantaged communities (*Nuin-Tara, OPR*)
5. **Decision-Making Framework:** Framework for climate-related decision-making and accountability (*Liz Whiteman & Juliette Hart, OST/USGS*)

## Future Phases

*May cover further refinement of guidance to energy utilities, guidance to smaller utilities, water and telecom utilities*

## Definition of climate adaptation for electric and gas utilities

**Strategic and data-driven consideration and incorporation of current and likely future climate-driven risks into utility planning, operations, and communications, in order to maintain safe, reliable, affordable, and resilient operations, in alignment with state policy goals.**

*CPUC Staff Proposal – discussed during 12/18/18 WG meeting*

*Final Session Report – sent to service list, 1/25/19*





## Climate Data Sources, Models, and Tools

***Provide guidance to utilities on which data sources and models should be utilized as the basis for inputs into their planning processes.***

- Identify climate data currently considered by IOUs
  - Identify a set of data criteria for selection of appropriate climate data
  - Applicability of data guidelines from other state agencies
- Staff Proposal – Climate Data Sources, Models, and Tools for Use in IOU Planning (issued 1/23/19)
    - Recommends IOUs adhere to guidance provided to most recent Climate Assessment climate data use guidelines
    - Proposes an initial set of data criteria for discussion
    - Proposes a Technical Advisory Group to review and update IOU climate data criteria and guidelines, annually







# Guidelines for Utility Climate Adaptation Assessment and Planning

***Develop recommendations as to how the CPUC and IOUs should select climate-related inputs for their planning and operations***

- Initial working group meeting at the CPUC on February 5
- Second meeting TBD





## Vulnerable and Disadvantaged Communities

***Develop recommendations on how to identify and prioritize investments and other activities that address the needs of vulnerable and disadvantaged communities as related to climate change impacts***

- First working group meeting on Monday, March 25 from 1-3pm at the California Energy Commission in Sacramento
- Discuss the definition of disadvantaged and vulnerable communities
- Staff has shared a background memo with working group participants
  - Proposes definitions for vulnerable and disadvantaged communities for discussion
  - References DAC AG's Equity Framework and definition of disadvantaged communities





## Vulnerable and Disadvantaged Communities

- The second working group meeting for the Vulnerable and Disadvantaged Communities Topic will be in May and will focus on the following questions:
  - How should utilities and Commission include vulnerable and disadvantaged communities in their efforts to identify and prioritize climate adaptation investments?
  - How should investments and other activities benefiting these communities in the context of climate change impacts be identified and prioritized?
- Staff is developing a facilitation document for the May meeting; similar to memo for 3/25 meeting





## Request for DAC AG Input

- Welcome input from the DAC AG; either as a joint body or from individual members
- Written input, presented at May working group meeting, is best way to ensure recommendations are included in the Working Group Session Report
  - Alternatively, if you are a party to the proceeding, you can submit your input via the normal comment process
- Due to timing of proceeding, would be best to focus comments on the questions that will be covered in the May meeting
- Participate in working group meetings either in person or remotely (WebEx)
- Working Group meetings are open to the public
