### **Agenda**

This staff workshop will include a brief background presentation on the triennial California Energy Code development cycle, the purpose of the Measure Proposal Template, and the schedule for the cycle. The workshop will cover the sections of the measure proposal template and conclude with a comment/question and answer period.

### **Background**

The California Energy Code is updated on an approximately three-year cycle. The 2022 California Energy Code will continue to improve upon the 2019 Building Energy Efficiency Standards for new construction of, and additions and alterations to, residential and nonresidential buildings. The 2022 Energy Code will go into effect on January 1, 2023, and will apply to building permit applications submitted on or after that date.

To facilitate public input and participation in these triennial rulemaking proceedings, the Energy Commission publishes a Measure Proposal Template on its Public Participation page (at <https://www.energy.ca.gov/title24/participation.html>). By presenting the Template at a public workshop, the Commission hopes to increase awareness and use

of the Template and broaden third-party participation in the development of current and future Energy Code updates.

## **Public Comment**

**Oral comments:** Staff will accept oral comments during the workshop. Comments may be limited to five minutes per speaker and one speaker per organization. Any comments may become part of the public record for this proceeding.

**Written comments:** Written comments must be submitted to the Docket Unit by **5:00 p.m. on June 30, 2019**. Written comments will also be accepted at the workshop; however, the Energy Commission may not have time to review them before the conclusion of the meeting.
