 - El Segundo Energy Center Petition to Amend
 - Proposed modifications include the demolition and replacement of two once-through-cooled natural gas-fired utility boiler units, Units 3 and 4, with one new combined cycle generator (Unit 9), one steam turbine generator (Unit 10) and two simple-cycle gas turbines (Units 11 and 12). This change will eliminate the use of ocean water for once-through cooling at the facility.

Energy Commission's Role

- Energy Commission has permitting authority over thermal power plants that are 50 megawatts or greater.
- The Commission is the lead state agency for California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) review and ongoing compliance.
- Energy Commission staff is an independent party in the proceeding. Staff will prepare an independent evaluation of the environmental, engineering, and public health/safety aspects of the proposed amendment.

Energy Commission's Role

- * There are five members of the Energy Commission. The Commission has appointed Commissioners Douglas (Presiding Committee Member) and Scott (Associate Committee Member) to oversee the licensing process for this amendment.
- Following staff review, the Committee will issue a Presiding Member's Proposed Decision (PMPD) that makes a recommendation to the full Commission to approve, reject, or change the proposed amendment.

EX PARTE RULE

- * All decisions made in this case will be made solely on the basis of the <u>public record</u>.
- No off-the-record contacts concerning substantive matters are permitted to take place between interested parties and the Commissioners, their advisers, this Committee, or the Hearing Officer.



EX PARTE RULE

- Contacts between interested parties and the members of the Committee regarding a substantive matter must occur in a <u>public</u> <u>forum</u> or in a writing distributed to all the parties and made available to the public.
- Purpose: to provide full disclosure to all participants of any information that may be used as a basis for the future Decision on this amendment.




El Segundo Power Facility Modification: Layout

Energy Commission Staff's Role

- Determine if the project, as modified, will remain in compliance with applicable laws, ordinances, regulations, and standards.
- Staff will perform an independent review the project for environmental impacts and propose mitigation as necessary.



Discovery and Analysis Process

- Determine if the proposed amendment complies with Laws, Ordinances, Regulations, Standards (LORS)
- Conduct engineering and environmental analysis
 - ✓ identify issues;
 - ✓ identify environmental impacts and mitigation measures;
 - ✓ recommend conditions of certification.
- Facilitate public and agency participation
- Staff products: Preliminary Staff Assessment (PSA) and Final Staff Assessment (FSA)
- Make recommendations to the Committee



Agency Coordination

Evidentiary Hearing & Decision Process

- Committee conducts hearings to create evidentiary record
- Issues Presiding Member's Proposed Decision (PMPD). The PMPD contains findings relating to:
 - Environmental impacts, public health, engineering
 - Project's compliance with LORS
 - Recommends conditions of certification
 - Recommends whether or not to approve the amendment
- Full Commission issues a Final Decision
- Appeals: Reconsideration by Commission; California Supreme Court



Energy Commission monitors compliance with all conditions of certification, for the life of the project and closure

Purpose

- Inform participants of potential issues
- Early focus on important topics



Staff's Potential Issue Areas

- Environmental Justice Population
- Coordination with SCAQMD / Project Schedule



POTENTIAL ISSUE: Environmental Justice Population

- * Based upon the 2010 Census data, **63.4** percent of the total population living within the six-mile buffer of the project site constitutes an environmental justice population.
- Staff will review the impacts resulting from the construction and operation of the proposed project, to determine impacts and necessary mitigation.
- Staff will work with the Hearing Officer and Public Advisor on public outreach regarding the project and its impacts.

Potential Issue Air Quality Schedule Timing

- Preliminary Determination of Compliance (PDOC) expected in November 2013 and a Final Determination of Compliance (FDOC) expected in April 2014.
- Energy Commission staff utilizes the PDOC and FDOC in their air quality analysis, the timing of the availability of these documents will impact the proposed schedule for producing an Energy Commission final decision.


