The business meeting date where the commission will decide the fate of SMUD's community energy application is now November 13, 2019. Energy Commission regulation 1104 (e) allows written comments filed at least three days before the commission meeting.

1104. Meetings.

20 CCR 1104 (e)

(e) Public Comments. Any person may file comments in writing on any agenda item. Unless otherwise directed by the presiding member, all written comments shall be filed at least three days before the commission meeting. Any person present shall be given an opportunity to make oral comments on any agenda item; provided however, that the presiding member may limit or preclude such comments as necessary for the orderly conduct of business.

1202. Right of Any Person to Comment.

20 CCR 1202 (b)

(b) Any person or interested agency may submit written comments to the commission by following the procedure set forth in section 1208.
