## Background

Public Resources Code Section 25402.1(h)(2) and Section 10-106 of Title 24, Part 1 (2016) (California Administrative Code) establish a process that allows local adoption of energy standards that are more stringent than the Energy Code. This process allows local governmental agencies to adopt and enforce energy standards for newly constructed buildings, additions, alterations, and repairs to existing buildings provided the CEC finds that the local standards will require buildings to be designed to consume no more energy than permitted by the Energy Code. Local jurisdictions are required to apply to CEC for approval, documenting the supporting analysis for how the local government has determined their proposed energy standards will save more energy than the current Energy Code and the basis of the local government's determination that its standards are cost effective.
